Redistricting Update — The Alaska Redistricting Board adopted a Final Proclamation of Redistricting on Wednesday, November 10. This decision marks the start of a 30-day litigation window as set forth in the Alaska Constitution. We anticipate one or more lawsuits that challenge some aspects of the Final Proclamation. How the potential lawsuit will impact our district, including our proposed senate district, is uncertain until we see the lawsuit and how the court rules.

ADOT Survey on Infrastructure Funding — Alaska's transportation and utility network is largely underdeveloped. From water lines to broadband and from docks to airports, expansion of Alaska's infrastructure is necessary and prudent. Responsible resource development is dependent upon reasonable access to the existing transportation infrastructure.

The bipartisan infrastructure bill signed into law by President Biden on Monday, November 15 will have a tremendous impact on Alaska. The Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities (DOT) is urging Alaskans to fill out a survey expressing their preferences for how we will spend money in the "Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act."

Each household is limited to one tree, which can be no more than 15 feet high. There are no fees, and a permit is not required.
