- **April 28 — Assembly Action on R-4A Multifamily Residential Mixed- Zoning District Title 21 Text Amendments, 6:30 p.m., Assembly Chambers, ZJ Loussac Library, 3600 Denali St.**
 AO NO. 2022-36: The proposed updates are intended to create a more pedestrian-oriented environment, allow more commercial space within mixed-use development, simplify phasing requirements, and make the R-4A requirements easier to follow. No changes to the zoning map are proposed. The Assembly held a public hearing on March 29th — postponed action to April 26th. TCC Land Use Committee reviewed the proposed amendments, but didn’t draft comments on the proposals, as they aren’t any current or likely areas in Turnagain affected.

- **April 30 — **COMMENT DEADLINE — AMENDMENT #3 — AMATS 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Program.**** Table 11 in 2019-2022 TIP would be updated by adding Amendment #3 — a new project called Alaska Cargo and Cold Storage. This is a large cargo facility proposed to be built at the Airport’s North Airpark in Postmark Bog wetlands. The project addition to the TIP is required because it is being funded in part with Better Utilizing Investments Leverage Development transportation grant funding from 2020. No regular AMATS funding allocations will be used on this facility, but it is federally required to be listed in the AMATS TIP since it is being constructed in the AMATS area with federal dollars. *TCC submitted comments on the previous 2019-2022 Plan in 2018; the TCC Board will review the proposed amendment and determine whether the council should provide comments. If comments are submitted, they will be on TCC May 7th meeting agenda for ratification consideration.*

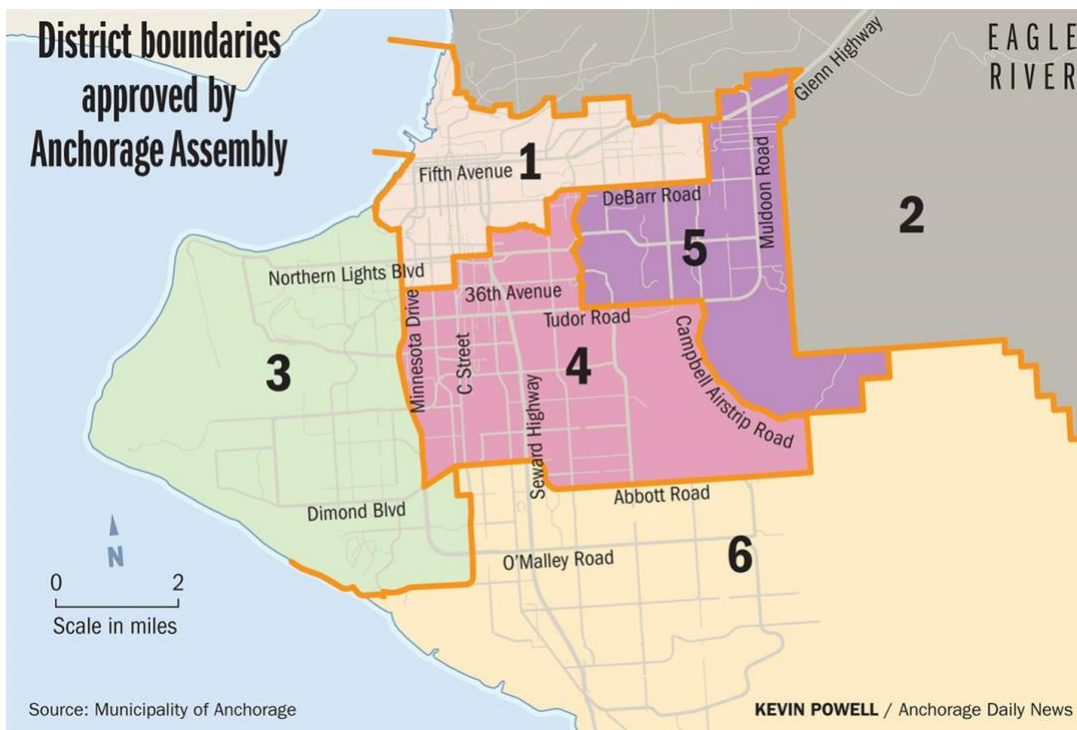
PROJECT UPDATES:

- **Airport Community Outreach Plan**

Every two years, the Airport requests public review and comment on this important Plan. The Plan establishes guidelines for effective-two-way communication between the Airport and the community. The first version collaboratively put together by the Airport and surrounding community councils, including Turnagain Community Council, in 2014. Comment Deadline was March 18th. *TCC Board submitted comments on the Plan; ratification consideration will be at our TCC April 7th meeting.*

- **Anchorage Finalized District Reapportionment Map**

On March 23rd, the Assembly approved a new Municipal Redistricting Map, which keeps *almost* all of the Turnagain Community Council boundaries in West Anchorage District 3. All but the southern half of Westchester Lagoon has been retained the West Anchorage District — southern half of Lagoon is now in the new North District 1 (formerly the Downtown District). A portion of Spenard was shifted from District 3 to District 1, but the West Anchorage boundaries expanded into the south Bayshore/Klatt CC area. The Assembly also set a special election to add a 12th Assembly member (second seat in District 1) for June, 21st. *TCC provided input and testimony supporting Map 11 v2 WITH AN AMENDMENT to include ALL of Turnagain CC boundaries within the District 3 area.*



- **Lyn Ary Park Ballfield Memorial Project**

The committee has been meeting regularly on the proposed a baseball memorial project, to be installed at the lower level of Lyn Ary Park adjacent to the Marston Fields. *TCC has representation on the committee and is providing input. The project committee has applied for a Anchorage Park Foundation 2022 Challenge Grant for the Memorial project; grantees will be noticed by AFP in May. TCC approved the proposed signage text and conceptual layout design at our March 3rd meeting. Previously, TCC passed a resolution supporting initial site location and concept project design in 2021.*

- **Temporary Traffic Pattern Put Into Effect for TSAIA South Terminal Loop Construction**

Starting March 30th, the South Terminal Loop is beginning the initial phase of significant and critical rehabilitation — necessitating a temporary traffic pattern until the completion of phase one of the project on May 25th. During this time, all three tower level traffic lanes nearest to the terminal outside the baggage claim area will be rerouted to the outer traffic lanes. Detour signage will direct traffic. Upon project completion, the terminal loop road, outside of the lower-level claim area, will have new pavement and drainage systems, upgraded curbside pedestrian access complying with FAA/ADA terminal requirements, and new lighting and paint.

- **Lake Hood User Group — Proposed GA Tie-Downs in Turnagain Bog**

At the November 8, 2022, meeting, the Lake Hood User Group agenda included Seasonal Wrap-up/Outlook and Development/Construction Updates — including a proposed relocation of Charlie Parking GA plane parking in Turnagain Bog, adjacent to the Turnagain neighborhood. Development of a new Airport Traffic Control Tower is being proposed in the current Charlie Parking area. Another presentation was given on this project at the March 17th User Group meeting. The FAA Project Lead stated that an Environmental Assessment for the Control Tower Relocation

and the Relocation of Charlie Parking in Turngain Bog would go out for public comment Fall 2022 — with projected construction for the new Control Tower occurring 2024-2027. *TCC Acting President (2021) and TCC Vice President (2022) Cathy Gleason provided information to the User Group on an Assembly ordinance that passed in 2001 [AO 2001-151 (S-2)], which contains legally-binding language requiring the Airport and the Municipality of Anchorage to conduct a joint Master Plan before any potential development occurs in the wetlands near the Turngain residential boundaries. The TCC Land Use Committee intends to follow up with this proposal.*

● LAKE HOOD SEAPLANE BASE WINTER OPERATIONS

With the changing season comes a change to air traffic around Lake Hood. The snow and ice will fluctuate due to Spring temperatures and sun exposure. The ice can go out any time from late-April to mid-May. Pilots should always check the FAA NOTAMs prior to utilizing the aerodrome to verify up-to-date weather and ice conditions. Only aircraft and ANC official vehicles are allowed on Lake Hood and Lake Spenard. **NO PEOPLE OR PETS ARE ALLOWED on lake surfaces**, this is for everyone's safety.

● **State of Alaska Signs Lease with Alaska Cargo and Cold Storage, LLC at Anchorage International Airport (ANC)**

Alaska Cargo and Cold Storage plans to develop a phased 32.5-million-cubic-foot cold storage facility at ANC on Postmark Bog wetlands west of Postmark Dr. Construction for the first phase will begin second half of 2021. When fully completed, the facility will offer cold and warm storage, quick cargo, and general warehousing options, logistics services, and auxiliary space for tenant offices. Space in this facility would be leased to third-party customers, including freight forwarders and cargo carriers. A \$21 million federal transportation grant will provide support funding for the project's first phase; total development cost is projected at \$220 million. *TCC Land Use Committee has requested a meeting with Alaska Cargo and Cold Storage sometime in March to discuss the project and potential mitigation measures to address impacts, including filling of Class A wetlands, ground noise, air emissions, commuter traffic increases on West Northern Lights through the Turngain neighborhood, etc. NO MEETING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED AS OF NOVEMBER 4th — still waiting to hear from Airport/Developer.*

● **Turngain/Spenard CC APF Challenge Grant for Spenard Beach Park Improvements**

The Turngain and Spenard Community Councils' joint Anchorage Park Foundation Challenge (matching) Grant application request for \$10,000 to update the Spenard Beach Park site plan and install picnic tables and park benches was **APPROVED** in 2019. *TCC voted to approve a conceptual site improvement plan at our December 5th, 2019, meeting.* Our fundraising flyer has been completed. We also submitted to the APF our request for a Grant Extension — which has now been extended to 2022, due to slow shipment of picnic tables and benches for the park. A project final report was submitted in December 2021. **HOPE TO HAVE PARK AMENITIES INSTALLED SOMETIME SPRING/SUMMER 2002!**

- **PLEASE NOTE:** Due to COVID-19 and the financial impacts it has had on tourist-related businesses in the park vicinity, TCC and SCC chose not to do outreach fundraising at this time. In order to meet our December 31st, 2020, challenge grant match deadline, Dan and Cathy Gleason donated \$5,000 to APF for improvements to Spenard Beach Park. *Many thanks to the Gleasons for this generous donation.* This will cover projects identified for the first phase — we will still be doing fundraising outreach at a future time, as there are more improvement projects we plan to make to this great community park.

- **AMATS NON-MOTORIZED PLAN ADOPTED (NOV. 2021)**

This Plan provides the vision for a non-motorized network within the AMATS Metropolitan Planning Area. When implemented, it will help residents travel more safely and efficiently throughout the area without the need of a motor vehicle in all seasons. - **FREE ANCHORAGE BIKE HELMET PROJECT & CHILD CAR SEAT INSPECTION INFO.**

The Anchorage Fire Department is part of the Anchorage Bike Helmet Project, which provides — **at no cost** — bike helmets for children under 15 years of age.

- Seven days a week, between 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., families may visit a Fire Station to have children fitted with bike helmets.

Certified personnel at Fire Stations also provide child car seat inspections **at no cost**.

- The inspection can determine:
 - if your child is in the appropriate car seat;
 - whether it is properly secured in the car,
 - whether your child is secured properly in the car seat, and
 - if it is on a recall list or outdated.
- *Alarming fact: four out of five car seats ARE NOT used correctly!*

- **APD PROTOCOL FOR COMMUNITY COUNCIL PROTOCOL INTERACTION**

The Anchorage Police Department has implemented protocol when interacting with Community Councils. The APD is divided into three overlapping shifts. Each shift has officers assigned to beat areas roughly in line with each Council boundary. Each area is covered on a regular basis, to work towards a more Community Policing model. Due to time limitations, Council meeting attendance requests are streamlining, so the request process is more efficiency.

- **CALL 3-1-1 TO REACH ANCHORAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR NON-EMERGENCIES**

A new telephone directory was launched March 27, 2018, to allow residents to reach often-accessed city services more easily, including the APD non-emergency line. The number prioritizes access to APD's non-emergency line, which will relieve pressure on 911 and is easier to remember than the seven-digit phone number.

In addition, Anchorage 311 will serve as a general directory for frequently contacted departments, such as Street Maintenance, Code Enforcement, the Mayor's Office, Traffic, the Municipal Clerk's Office, Fees and Taxes, Vehicle Impound, and Health and Human Services.
