## Urban Housing Workshop

Affordable housing is of increasing concern. As Anchorage continues to grow, in size and density, new approaches are needed to ensure entry-level and part-time workers, college students and seniors have convenient access to affordable shelter.

The Fairview Community Council recognizes the important role traditionally played by the East Downtown area in providing workforce housing. The Council is also very aware that a strong and vital neighborhood requires a balanced approach between workforce housing, affordable shelter, housing for knowledge workers and other market rate housing options.

As part of the on-going activities associated with development of the Fairview Community Plan and the Fairview Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy Area (NRSA), the Council is seeking public input on what that balance should be in the East Downtown area.

Do you care about the present and/or future quality of life in Fairview? Are you concerned about protecting your equity investment in your home or rental property?

## Some Ideas

- Mixed use developments combining housing with an affordable component with retail, office or institutional uses along Gambell Street • Apartments over and 6th Avenue could be encouraged. The housing in these developments could range from single family attached units, condos, cluster hous• Density bonuses ing to traditional multifamily units. Buildings themselves do not need to be mixed, but rather the whole parcel could be. Adoption of a HUD a mixed development
- The development of co-housing and other innovative housing options could be encouraged.

- The development of accessory units such as "mother-inlaw" apartments or "granny flats" could be encouraged.
  - ground floor retail/ office space in the Community Mixed Corridor could be encouraged.
- could be provided in the north Fairview area to encourage affordable housing development.
- approved NRSA would provide access to new financial options while allowing for a balanced integration of market-rate housing.
