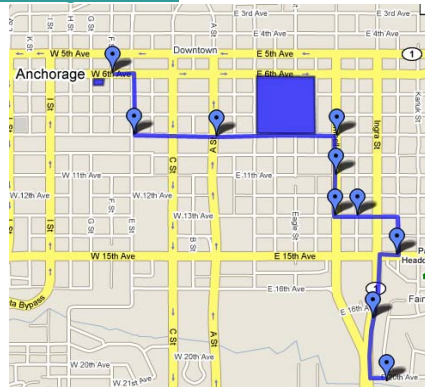

THE FAIRVIEW COMMUNITY COUNCIL HOSTS “JANE’S WALK ANCHORAGE” —Anchorage, AK - Thousands of people in hundreds of neighborhoods around the world will participate in the second annual “Jane’s Walk”. This year the Fairview Community Council is hosting “**Jane’s Walk Anchorage**” at **9:30 am on Saturday, May 2nd. Meet at the Chester Creek trailhead at 20th and Ingra** for coffee and pastries! Inspired by urban activist Jane Jacobs, “Jane’s Walk” helps put people in touch with their environment and with each other, bridging social and geographic gaps and creating a space for cities to discover themselves. Everyone is invited to come stroll, bike, wheelchair or juggle through the Midtown-Downtown connection in Fairview. Fairview is a dynamic changing neighborhood and provides a living laboratory for exploring Jane Jacobs’ ideas here in Anchorage. Community members act as tour guides as we explore Fairview and discuss revitaliza-

tion efforts underway in Fairview and east Downtown. We will end our 2-mile walk across from City Hall, because “People Make the Difference!” The Fairview Community Council is developing its Neighborhood Revitalization Strategy in an effort to restore and revitalize the Gambell-Ingra corridor and build upon our community’s strengths. The proposed Highway to Highway connection project has the potential to dramatically reshape the neighborhood, and residents are busy working to ensure a vibrant future for Fairview. April's Fairview Workshops

North Fairview Design Workshop - April 4th Residents gathered to discuss the future of the commercial area of north Fairview. It is anticipated the Highway to Highway project will change the number of vehicle trips through this area. Such a change in road traffic will likely cause some current businesses to re-locate, go out of business or change their business model. Workshop participants reviewed land use,

zoning and other community information to determine a best case future for the area. The group recommended that the Fairview Community Plan modify the land use plan map to show the area as community mixed use.



Affordable Urban Housing Workshop - April 18th Residents and agency representatives met to discuss the issue of affordable housing as part of the Fairview Community Plan and the Fairview Revitalization Strategy. Presentations were given on the Community Plan and Affordable Housing. Participants broke into two groups to answer three questions: What are the affordable housing issues in the east Downtown area? How can these issues be addressed? What Action Steps are needed? Check the Council website for a more detailed write-up of both workshops.
