Consider this: If Alaska's prison population continues to grow at 4 percent annually and our costs per prisoner grow at a conservative 2 percent, the total expense of Alaska's prison system will grow from \$260 million to more than \$1 billion dollars annually by 2035. In that same time frame, we will be forced to build four more prisons, each the size of the new Goose Creek facility and costing the taxpayers \$250 million apiece."


