People Mover will add 5 extra service routes to the 45 this year. The 45 is the only bus line that serves the Mountain View area, and has the highest ridership of any line in the Anchorage area. The Municipality will add an extra five stops to the line, increasing the frequency of stops during the day, at the times of peak ridership.

In June, ground was broken at the site, which consists of the current parking lot, the former MTS gallery, and the former furniture warehouse. And the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC) will soon be starting work on an 80-unit housing development next to Clark Middle School and the Glenn Square Mall.

Mountain View Neighborhood Plan Updates

A first draft of the Mountain View Neighborhood Plan has been drafted, and the Anchorage Community Land Trust (ACLT) is now organizing focus groups, in order to hear what you want for the future of your neighborhood.

- I. The Anchorage 2020 Comprehensive Plan estimates that Northeast Anchorage will need to accommodate an additional 5,000-7,000 dwelling units by 2020 to keep up with demand for housing. What are the best locations in Mountain View to add or build new housing units?
- 2. What types of new affordable housing should be built?
- 3. Does Mountain View need more affordable housing options, or should most of the new units built be available at market rate?
- 4. How can we make bus transit more convenient? Does the bus route need to be expanded, and do the existing bus stops meet the needs of the neighborhood?
- 5. How can we expand pedestrian facilities, and in what areas of the neighborhood do sidewalks and street crossings need to be improved?
- 6. Do we have enough parks and green spaces in Mountain View? What improvements need to be made in existing parks to make them more of an asset for the neighborhood? Do you think we need new parks or gardens, and if so, what are the best locations for them?
- 7. What spaces on Mountain View Dr., Bragaw St., or Commercial Dr. are underutilized?
- 8. The Anchorage 2020 Comprehensive Plan prioritizes providing "distinctive public landmarks and other public places in neighborhoods". What public landmarks does Mountain View already have? And what new landmarks do you think would help us celebrate Mountain View?
- 9. How can we build upon Mountain View's arts and culture legacy? Where would you like to see new public artworks and cultural amenities?

We appreciate you taking the time to answer these questions, and your answers will be incorporated into the final draft of the Neighborhood Plan.
