PROJECT UPDATES:

• BIG NEWS! LEGAL BATTLE OVER LYN ARY PARK MEMORIAL GARDEN IS FINALLY OVER! On February 16, 2017, the Alaska Supreme Court issued two orders that DENIED the private property owners' request for reconsideration and hearing of their previous ruling in favor of the Municipality of Anchorage. On September 26, 2016, the Appellants filed for a Petition for Rehearing; and on October 17, 2016, a Reconsideration or for Relief from Judgment was filed. According to Assistant Municipal Robert Owens, "The Lyn Ary Community Garden case is finally over!" Many, many thanks to Bob and others from the MOA Legal Dept. for diligently working on this legal battle for 10+ years!

Parks & Recreation Commission Resolution on Proposed Point Woronzof Park Overlay on the 2040
 Land Use Plan Public Hearing Draft Map

On February 9th, the Parks and Recreation Commission passed a resolution on the 2040 Land Use Plan Public Hearing Draft. Based on testimony provided by TCC Acting President Cathy Gleason, which reflected TCC's position regarding the proposed "Potential Airport Growth Alternative" overlay on Point Woronzof Park, the commission included an amendment to the resolution that recommends REMOVAL OF THE OVERLAY ON THE LUP MAP — this is a big win for TCC! The P&RC's resolution will be presented to the Planning & Zoning Commission and the Assembly for consideration.

- Parks & Recreation Commission Resolution on Mile 2.2 Tony Knowles Coastal Trail Bench Project On February 9th, the Parks and Recreation Commission passed a resolution approving the proposed bench project at Mile 2.2 of the Coastal Trail. This bench — with built-in bike rakes and plenty of seating — will replace the current benches, which are in disrepair. TCC Acting President Cathy Gleason provided testimony, which reflected TCC's position in support of the bench project.
- Parks & Recreation Commission Resolution on the Audubon Wayfinding Project Along the Tony Knowles Coastal Trail

On February 9th, the Parks and Recreation Commission passed a resolution approving the proposed wayfinding project between the Alaska Railroad overpass and the Fish Creek Estuary along the Coastal Trail. This new area will replace a smaller, existing pull-off area — and provide a larger viewing area with benches, bike rakes and a trash receptacle. TCC Acting President Cathy Gleason provided testimony, which reflected TCC's position in support of the Audubon-sponsored project.

Turnagain Blvd. Upgrade

The final design has been released for review. While the comment deadline was March 1, the TCC Board will review the plan and provide any final comments, based on TCC's previous positions and input. PROJECT CONSTRUCTION FUNDING IS INCLUDED IN THE MOA ROADS & DRAINAGE BOND ON THE APRIL 4th BALLOT. Upgrades to Turnagain Blvd. is TCC's highest priority CIP Roads & Drainage project, with Turnagain St. ranked third. MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE APRIL 4TH 2017 BOND PACKAGES

The Municipality is proposing a \$46M bond package for the April 4th ballot, which would cost \$11.38 per \$100,000 of assessed property value for debt service. The city is retiring \$36M in general purpose bonds. The Roads & Drainage bond includes construction upgrade funding for Turnagain Blvd.

Also on the April 4th ballot will be a \$58M Anchorage School District bond, which includes <u>funding for West High heating</u> <u>and ventilation replacement as well as \$6.8M for West High and Romig Middle library and counseling improvements</u>. The school bond would cost \$11.67 in annual property taxes per \$100,000 of assessed property value.
