Muni Assembly Update

Assemblyman Forrest Dunbar's report:

- The Assembly did approve expanding the number of taxis working within the Municipality of Anchorage.
- The Muni has opened a new area to provide more information to citizens. It can be accessed via www.data.muni.org.

Assemblyman Pete Peterson's report:

 The State of Alaska Dept. of Transportation is not plowing as many miles of road as it used to so the Muni is picking up the slack. Whereas the goal used to be 72 hours to clear roads, now it is 84 hours after each snowfall. If there's snow between storms it will take longer.

Parks & Recreation Service Area Presentation

Road Maintenance & Restoration

Jason Bockenstedt (907-343-9290) and Jim Belz (907-343-8265) of the Muni Maintenance & Operations Dept., Street Maintenance Division told those in attendance that they have found \$200,000 in muni funds to fix the road from the musher's bridge to the top of the big hill. (This has been on ongoing effort by Pete Peterson, Forrest Dunbar, Don Crafts, and all the members of the LRSA Board. THANK YOU!) All the parties are now working on an agreement on how this work is to be completed. Muni officials say that they can use this funding, but that the Basher Community cannot ever expect to see any additional funds from the muni for any road issues in the foreseeable future. Their take is that these fixes will last about 12 years.
