PROJECT UPDATES:

New People Mover Bus System Began October 23rd. As part of the effort to better serve riders in higher ridership areas, routes have been reconfigured, with more frequent pick ups at bus stops, and increased operation hours. PLEASE NOTE: these changes resulted in the Turnagain neighborhood losing its bus service, as of October 23rd (Route 36 was eliminated).  Proposed State Regulation Changes to Allow Retail Marijuana Licensees to Apply for Onsite Consumption

On Oct. 10th, the Assembly made several recommendations to the State's proposed regulations that would allow marijuana onsite consumption at retail locations. *TCC approved comments at our October* 5th *meeting, which expressed concerns with the proposal; four TCC members also testified against the onsite consumption regulations at the Assembly hearing on Oct.* 10th. *TCC sent our comments to the Marijuana Control Board as well.*

• <u>2017 Traffic Calming Projects in Turnagain</u>

HDL Engineering Consultants presented an update at TCC's Oct. 5th meeting. *Traffic calming "speed cushions" are now slated to be installed next spring at:*

- 33rd Ave. between Wisconsin St. and Turnagain St.
- McKenzie Dr. between Sagan Cir. and Milky Way Dr.

These traffic calming speed cushions will be longer, with flat tops, and provide gaps to allow emergency vehicle wheels to travel through them. AFD opposed the proposed traditional speed humps, as they reduce emergency response time, can damage vehicle suspensions, and put firefighters at a safety risk as they drive over them.

• 2040 Anchorage Land Use Plan

After a two-year planning effort that started in 2015, the Anchorage Assembly approved the Draft 2040 Anchorage Land Use Plan, Planning & Zoning Recommended Draft, with amendments, on September 26th.

Summary of three major TCC recommendations:

• <u>APPROVED! Heritage Land Bank Land west of the Airport, where sections of the Tony Knowles</u> <u>Coastal Trail and Sisson Loop Trail are located</u> — TCC's request to designate this land "Parks or Natural Areas" WAS RECOMMENDED by the Planning & Zoning Commission, and WAS APPROVED by the Assembly (12-0)! TCC will continue to advocate for the transfer of this land to the Parks Dept. for formal parkland dedication.

- APPROVED! Western area of Turnagain Bog adjacent to the Turnagain neighborhood TCC's request to ENLARGE the "Potential Open Space Alternative" overlay designation area of this important wetland WAS APPROVED by the Assembly (9-2)! While the Airport Master Plan shows potential development for this area, the Muni Planning Dept.'s upcoming effort to create an Airport Zoning District will reflect the importance of a large area of this high-value wetland to the Turnagain neighborhood.
- APPROVED! Point Woronzof Park, where portions of the Tony Knowles Coastal Trail and Anchorage Coastal Wildlife Refuge as well as a Dena'ina archeological site are located — TCC's request to REMOVE the "Potential Airport Expansion Alternative" overlay over this Municipal dedicated parkland WAS APPROVED (6-5)! The draft plan included this overlay to represent a potential 2nd North-South runway that would destroy the park; TCC has opposed the proposal ever since it was first proposed in 2007.

TCC thanks those Assembly members who supported TCC's and the community's support to permanently protect these important natural open space areas in Turnagain! <u>Fish Creek Trail Connection — Northwood Dr. to Spenard Rd.</u> This project will construct a new, 1.7-mile paved trail and a pedestrian bridge over Fish Creek, connecting Spenard Rd. and Northwood Dr. JTA Construction is scheduled to begin clearing for the future trails and preparing for the bridge in early October. Project is scheduled to be completed in Summer 2018. • ANC Runway 15/33 (North-South Runway) Rehabilitation

The Environmental Assessment has been finalized. Among other items TCC requested to be considered in the EA was concerns about potential impacts of the runway extension shifting heavy cargo takeoff/landings to the north and impacting on Pt. Woronzof bluff erosion. These concerns were dismissed in the EA. To accommodate construction, Runway 15/33 will need to be closed to operations for two summer construction seasons in 2018 and 2019.
