

**Answers to questions that our CC had about  
the proposed Russian Jack single track trails.**

**1) How will moose be effected? Will the trails interrupt moose calving season like in Kincaid?**

Parks is not aware of trails interrupting moose calving. We are aware that the proximity of humans to moose during calving can often aggravate the concerned mother.

**2) Who will be doing the ongoing maintenance of the trails once they are built?**

Parks and Recreation will be responsible for the ongoing maintenance through maintenance staff, Youth Employment in Parks and planned volunteer events.

**3) Will a "no" vote on the resolution effect anything? Will the trails be built regardless of their support?**

The grant funding has been held up because of objections from the Northeast CC. The goal is to say that there are 5 Comm Councils in the area and that it is a regional park. My hope is that we can show that 4 out of 5 want the trails and that may restore the funding.

**4) How many trees will be removed?**

The proposed project uses existing trails and tree removal will be minimal. Trail alignment will always take quality established trees into consideration, with invasive species removed through the trail development.

**5) Has Fish and Game weighed in on the resolution? What is their perspective?**

They have not weighed in on this project specific and we utilize an established constraint that ADF&G provided for trail development in natural resource areas.

**6) They pointed out concerns about a couple of areas on the south side of the plans: the first was a section of the trail near the headwaters of the spring that they described as very narrow, the second was at the bottom of the diagram they goes through a swamp.**

Trail development will not occur in wetlands.
