PROJECT UPDATES:

• Salvation Army Not Renewing Clitheroe Center Lease on HLB land west of Airport
The Salvation Army recently announced they will not be renewing their long-held lease for the Clitheroe Center, located on Heritage Land Bank west of the Airport. Instead, they will relocated it into existing midtown facilities. Nancy Burke, Municipal Homeless Coordinator, stated that the city still plans to move forward with a \$52M "Wellness Center" homeless housing facility that would include a wide variety of services. The facility would be located west of the Airport on Heritage Land Bank land near the Tony Knowles Coastal Trail south of Point Woronzof. The goal is for the funding to appear as a statewide bond. TCC received general, preliminary information from Nancy Burke and Steve Fishback at our March 1st TCC meeting. They will be meeting with TCC's Land Use Committee in the future, to provide more details as they become available.

Proposed Accessory Dwelling Units Municipal Code Title 21 Amendments

On December 4th, the Planning & Zoning Commission voted to support the proposals to allow larger and detached ADUs on residential lots, including single-family lots, allow on-street resident parking, and reduce lot setbacks and design standards, to expand the supply of residential rental units in Anchorage. Their recommendation will now go before the Assembly for final consideration. At our October 5th meeting, TCC approved comments that expressed concerns regarding the proposed amendments, which were sent to the P&ZC and the Assembly (see TCC website for comment letter). TCC approved two additional recommendations at our February 1st meeting. Assembly is anticipated to schedule work sessions in the near future.

ANC Runway 15/33 (North-South Runway) Rehabilitation

Project will rehabilitate and widen RW 15/33 and update taxiway geometry to meet FAA standards through the summers of 2018 and 2019. The runway will be partially closed during the 2018 summer and fully closed during the 2019 summer. Both construction seasons will require heavy cargo aircraft to be shifted to the east-west runways. 2019 summer construction will require all aircraft to utilize the east-west runways. **CONSTRUCTION IS SCHEDULED TO BEGIN JUNE 1**ST.

2018 Traffic Calming Projects in Turnagain

HDL Engineering Consultants presented an update at TCC's Oct. 5th, 2017, meeting. *Traffic calming "speed cushions" are now slated to be installed spring/summer 2018 at:*

- 33rd Ave. between Wisconsin St. and Turnagain St.
- McKenzie Dr. between Andree Dr. and Milky Way Dr.

These traffic calming speed cushions will be longer, with flat tops, and provide gaps to allow emergency vehicle wheels to travel through them. AFD opposed the proposed traditional speed humps, as they reduce emergency response time, can damage vehicle suspensions, and put firefighters at a safety risk as they drive over them.

An additional street — Loussac Dr. between Lord Baranof Dr. and Illiamna Ave. — was also included in the "2018 Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program Qualified Streets List." An update on the Turnagain Traffic Calming projects will be provided at the May 3rd TCC meeting.

Turnagain Blvd. Upgrades

Proposed State Regulation Changes to Allow Retail Marijuana Licensees to Apply for Onsite Consumption

On Oct. 10th, the Assembly made several recommendations to the State's proposed regulations that would allow marijuana onsite consumption at retail locations. In Nov. 2017, and then again in April 2018, the Marijuana Control Board postponed discussion of the proposal, now scheduled for June. *TCC approved comments at our October 5th meeting, which expressed concerns with the proposal; four TCC members also testified against the onsite consumption regulations at the Assembly hearing on Oct. 10th. <i>TCC sent our comments to the Marijuana Control Board as well.*

CALL 3-1-1 TO REACH ANCHORAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR NON-EMERGENCIES

A new telephone directory was launched March 27, 2018, to allow residents to reach often-accessed city services more easily, including the APD non-emergency line. The number prioritizes access to APD's non-emergency line, which will relieve pressure on 911 and is easier to remember than the seven-digit phone number.

In addition, Anchorage 311 will serve as a general directory for frequently contacted departments, such as Street Maintenance, Code Enforcement, the Mayor's Office, Traffic, the Municipal Clerk's Office, Fees and Taxes, Vehicle Impound, and Health and Human Services.
