

East Anchorage District Plan (an element of the Anchorage 2020 Comprehensive Plan) Areawide "Visioning Workshop" for public input was held May 22 at Begich Middle School. We encourage additional comments supporting a new community park at Muldoon and DeBarr and a bicycle trail along the JBER military boundary. This connects the bicycle trail system from Eagle River past Centennial Park at the Glenn Highway to Bicentennial Park at Tudor Road.

The Federal Aviation Administration comment period has closed on a proposed 230-foot cross.

Anchorage Baptist Temple has proposed construction of a 230-foot cross at Northern Lights Blvd. and Baxter Road this summer. The FAA would allow it; comments to Anchorage Planning & Zoning will open soon.

Scenic Foothills Streets Upgrade Report.

Widening and upgrading East 32nd Avenue from Muldoon Road east to Shamrock Street will begin on or about July 15 and will be completed this fall, though some of the landscaping may wait until spring. Area legislators secured an extra \$1 million to upgrade all of Cherry Street between 32th Avenue and 36th Avenue. Cherry Street will be fixed but not widened. The project is fully funded; it will be done next year, to avoid tearing up too many roads at once. Both projects will require detours while major work is done. Our part of town—from the Tudor-Muldoon curve to the swerve onto the Glenn Highway—is named after Anchorage pioneer homesteader Arnold L. Muldoon. He put up a log cabin among the spruce trees near Northern Lights Boulevard in the winter of 1940. He packed the materials out on his back, along a muddy trail that became Muldoon Road. Arnold L. Muldoon Park, named in his honor, preserves a portion of his original homestead. You may have noticed some of "Arnie's Army" of volunteers planting and tending flowers in Pioneer Drive median and Chugach Foothills Park. Volunteers are needed for watering crews. Volunteers are always welcome to help weed and water and Spruce Up Muldoon. There is plenty to do!
