### **NOVEMBER-DECEMBER 2018 NOTICES:**

**November 1 — COMMENT DEADLINE — Proposed Addition of Onsite Marijuana Consumption to the Retail License.** The Marijuana Control Board is considering proposed regulation changes to 3 AAC 306 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with onsite marijuana consumption for retail establishments. The draft allows for outdoor consumption areas, if the board finds that compatible with neighborhood uses. Local governments, via ordinance or a ballot question, could bar onsite use or aspects of it, such as smoking. In August of this year, the Marijuana Control Board voted for a 60-day comment period and hearing on the proposed onsite consumption regulations. *TCC approved comments at our October 5 2017, meeting, which expressed concerns with the marijuana onsite consumption proposal; four TCC members also testified against the onsite consumption regulations at the Assembly hearing on Oct. 10<sup>th</sup>. TCC sent our comments to the Marijuana Control Board at that time as well.* 

November 6 — Alaska General Election. Governor and legislative seats are on the ballot. Please note: this
is NOT a mail-in ballot process — you will need to go to your polling place to vote (or request an absentee ballot
by October 22nd).

## **PROJECT UPDATES:**

- Point Woronzof AWWU Beach Tower Erosion Control Project Completed
  - In August, the project to place boulders around the AWWU tower on the mudflats at Point Woronzof was completed. A pathway was included, so allow for pedestrian access on the beach through this area.
- Turnagain Blvd. Rehabilitation Near Completion

Improvements to Turnagain Blvd. were the number one TCC CIP roads & drainage project for many years and the project is very close to completion. Project included repaving, curb and gutter, trail along Fish Creek Park, landscaping and other amenities.

Pedestrian Pathways Between Neighborhood and West/Romig Campus Rehabilitated

Repaving of two important pathways off Arlington and Belmont Drs. and the school campus was completed in August — just in time for the start of the fall school schedule. TCC and the Safe Routes to Schools Committee advocated for the rehabilitation of these pathways, which had degraded and had become a safety hazard over the last several years.

# 2018 Traffic Calming Projects in Turnagain

Traffic calming features were installed this summer at:

- 33<sup>rd</sup> Ave. between Wisconsin St. and Turnagain St.
- McKenzie Dr. between Andree Dr. and Milky Way Dr.

A traditional speed hump was installed on 33<sup>rd</sup> Ave. But a 'speed cushion' was placed on McKenzie. The speed cushions is longer, with a flat top, and provide gaps to allow emergency vehicle wheels to travel through them.

Accessory Dwelling Units Municipal Code Title 21 Amendments

On June 12<sup>th</sup>, the Assembly voted to allow larger and detached ADUs on residential lots, including single-family lots, allow on-street resident parking, and reduce lot setbacks and design standards, to expand the supply of residential rental units in Anchorage. At our October 5' 2017, meeting, TCC approved comments that expressed concerns regarding the proposed amendments, which were sent to the P&ZC and the Assembly (see TCC website for comment letter). TCC approved two additional recommendations at our February 1<sup>st</sup> meeting. President Cathy Gleason also testified at the Assembly hearing.

# Spenard Beach Park/TCC Donation for Amenities

### Westchester Lagoon South Bridge will be Replaced This Fall

Replacement of the bridge on the south side of Westchester Lagoon will happen this year. The viewing platform will extend 16 feet out into the lagoon, to give adequate separation between platform users and Coastal Trail users. TCC provided input on design elements at our May 3<sup>rd</sup> TCC meeting and an update will be provided at our September 6<sup>th</sup> meeting.

## Dempsey Anderson Ice Arena Exterior Painting Funds Approved

On May 8<sup>th</sup>, the Assembly approved a resolution (AR No. 2018-142) appropriating \$53,000 for exterior wall painting of the Dempsey Anderson Ice Arena, which is scheduled for this summer. Due to TCC Treasurer Gloria Manni's attention to this long-overdue maintenance project, TCC initiated the repainting project request in March. Special thanks to Office of Economic & Community Development Director Christopher Schutte, and Office of Economic & Community Development Principal Administrative Officer Renee Stewart for their efforts — as well as to the Assembly for their support of this upgrade to a popular and highly-visible recreational facility in Turnagain. As of September 5<sup>th</sup>, the painting project has yet to be done.

# Alaska Railroad Bridge Over W. Northern Lights Graffiti Removal

Many thanks to MOA Public Works for doing interim work to cover graffiti on the highly visible AKRR bridge in Turnagain! The lighter coat of paint applied this spring will be followed up next year with a more extensive effort (based on funding availability), including full sandblasting and a thicker layer of paint on both the bridge and retaining walls. Graffiti sealant will also be applied.

## Forest Park Dr. Retaining Wall Repair (by Lyn Ary Park Tennis Courts)

Repairs to this retaining wall were recently completed. *Many thanks to Turnagain resident Greg Mills*, for bringing this to the attention of the Municipality, so that it could be repaired. *Also thanks to Paul Vanlandingham*, *MOA Street Maintenance Manager*, for his prompt response to this matter.

## ANC Runway 15/33 (North-South Runway) Rehabilitation

Project involves rehabilitating and widening RW 15/33 and update taxiway geometry to meet FAA standards through the summers of 2018 and 2019. The runway has been partially closed during the 2018 summer and will be fully closed during the 2019 summer. Both construction seasons will require heavy cargo aircraft to be shifted to the east-west runways. 2019 summer construction will require all aircraft to utilize the east-west runways. The runway will be reopened full-length in October.

Project will reconstruct Taxiway V for Airplane Design Group 1 and Taxiway Design Group 2. Improvements include upgrading the taxiway structural section, replacing and upgrading taxiway lighting, markings and signs, repairing/replacing storm drainage, and adjusting conflicting utilities, as needed. **CONSTRUCTION IS ESTIMATED TO TAKE PLACE MAY 29<sup>TH</sup> THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30TH.** Various detour routes will be provided throughout the project to accommodate vehicle and aircraft traffic.

## ASSEMBLY PASSES PLASTIC BAG BAN!

On August 28<sup>th</sup>, the Anchorage Assembly voted to entirely ban disposable plastic shopping bags of any thickness from local retail stores. The goal is to reduce litter and encourage consumers to bring their own reusable bags to the store. The ban does not apply to smaller plastic bags used for produce, meat, bulk foods, etc. Retailers will be required to charge a fee of up to 50 cents for handing out paper bags to shoppers. The ban will be put into effect March 1, 2019.

### AMERICAN RED CROSS OF ALASKA INSTALLING FREE SMOKE ALARMS

The American Red Cross of Alaska, along with local fire departments, businesses and community groups, are installing more than 2,000 smoke alarms by June 31<sup>st</sup>, to promote home fire safety. Teams of trained Red Cross volunteers are conducting in-person home visits to install FREE 10-year lithium battery alarms upon request as well as provide home fire safety information and fire escape plans.

## CALL 3-1-1 TO REACH ANCHORAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR NON-EMERGENCIES

A new telephone directory was launched March 27, 2018, to allow residents to reach often-accessed city services more easily, including the APD non-emergency line. The number prioritizes access to APD's non-emergency line, which will relieve pressure on 911 and is easier to remember than the seven-digit phone number.

In addition, Anchorage 311 will serve as a general directory for frequently contacted departments, such as Street Maintenance, Code Enforcement, the Mayor's Office, Traffic, the Municipal Clerk's Office, Fees and Taxes, Vehicle Impound, and Health and Human Services.
