If you can't bring a dish do please come and help us cele-

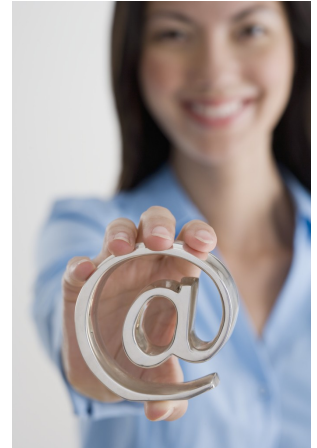
Come and join us! and get informed on issues affecting your neighborhood. We want to hear your voice and need your input.

Secretary's Report

Teri Peters, Department of Parks and Recreation: Teri is the new director of the Fairview Community Recreation Center. She will be working on additional programming for youth. Saturday December 12th will host a youth clean up Fairview day at the Center. Contact Teri at 343-4297.

John Tolley, Municipal Project Director for Highway to Highway: John provided an update on the H2H scoping process.

The team are currently reviewing the preliminary range of alternatives to select those routes that will receive further consideration. Additionally, a series of land use and transit alternatives have been included. Contact John at 269-7531 for more info.

Patrick Flynn, Assembly Update: The municipality is still dealing with finalizing next year's budget. Patrick has introduced amendments that would restore

bus service in the late morning and evenings, and he has proposed an increase to the library budget of \$1/2 million dollars. He has also proposed to continue community grants for the arts community, and to continue funding for programs including Campfire and Project Access.



Neighborhood Plan Committee Report

A revision of the Final Draft Fairview Community Plan was introduced at the November General Membership meeting by the Neighborhood Plan Committee. The revision:

1. Incorporates new information related to the concept of a Northern Neighborhood Overlay Zone,
2. Removes graphics associated with H2H project,
3. Adds in Public Outreach events and efforts,

4. Modifies the draft Land Use Plan Map,
5. Adds in Implementation tables,
6. Makes changes in the narrative.

The Revised Final Draft Plan is available on-line at the Council's website. The Revised Plan was referred back to the Neighborhood Plan Committee as a working draft subject to incorporation of relevant public comments. Comments are being ac-
