
FACELIFT BEGINS ON PENNEY'S GARAGE

New paint, improved lighting, safer elevators and security guards are just part of the \$1.6 million renovation underway at the **JC Penney Garage** in downtown Anchorage.

The first color of a multi-phase paint job is being put on the garage. The color scheme of cinnamon, sage, brown and a taupe-colored crown molding is designed to make the garage more inviting and a focal point for downtown.

The Anchorage Community Development Authority took over management of the garage in October as part of the administration's commitment to adding more parking spaces downtown. The garage has been under-utilized in recent years, and the security measures along with the renovation are designed to make it a safer, more enticing place to park.

HELP FUND DOWNTOWN COMMUNITY PATROL

The Anchorage Cabaret, Hotel, Restaurant & Retailers Association (CHARR) in collaboration with the Downtown Bar Association is working to establish a Downtown Community Patrol.

The Downtown Community Patrol will consist of two teams of two professional security guards patrolling the downtown streets on Friday and Saturday nights between 12:00 a.m. and 4:00 a.m. to provide safer streets for customers, employees, and the community.

The Downtown Community Patrol will:

- Patrol the downtown core area
- Utilize car, bike and foot patrolling
- Report incidents directly to Anchorage Police
- Prevent victimization with an emphasis on sexual assault crimes

- Track reports and incidents to measure effectiveness
- Work with local businesses and agencies, APD, government officials and other community patrols to address problems

CHARR would like to ask downtown businesses to help sponsor the Downtown Community Patrol with a yearly donation of \$500 or \$1000. Businesses that choose to help sponsor the Downtown Community Patrol will be recognized at public events, on posters, in newspaper ads, on radio & television, in CHARR newsletters, and at all press events.

ARTWORKING SHOW AND FUNDRAISER AT SHIP CREEK CENTER

The 2nd Annual ArtWorking juried art show and fundraiser opens at the Ship Creek Center this Friday, June 2 with a free public reception from 5 – 8 p.m. that will include a meet-and-greet with participating artists, a tour of the exhibit, live music, appetizers and a no-host bar.

ArtWorking, which features nearly 50 emerging Alaska artists, is more a diverse, colorful art exhibit that seeks to promote and encourage Alaska's many talented – yet largely unknown – artists while supporting the work of two community-based organizations – **Stone Soup Group (SSG)** and the **Mountain View Arts & Culture District Association (MACD)**.

During the exhibition, visitors can vote for their favorite piece, bid on artwork in the silent auction, and learn about the artists and beneficiaries. Beginning in July, limited edition posters of the 1st place artwork will also be available for purchase.

On September 9, the artwork will be **sold in a live and silent auction**, held in conjunction with the Latino Lions Club Fall Fiesta. Proceeds from the poster sales and auction will go to support the work of participating artists, **SSG** and **MACD**.
