**Meeting was called to order at 7:30pm, by president Mr. Peter Hamlett.**

**There were multiple guest speakers present, but only 1 community member.**

**Berta Gardner:**

**She visited with us about the fact that a new building for the Legislature is being looked into.**

**She also brought up the topic about the all the slope workers that live outside of Alaska. The study into this is ongoing.**

**Zach from Senator Ellis's office spoke about the film tax relief, and that there are not enough local workers to support the jobs needed for movie crews to film up here. We need more experienced film crew members to keep the movie companies coming north.**

**Mr. Traini:**

**He informed us that the I.M. testing for Anchorage residents is likely to be discontinued within the next 6 months. The EPA will release its finding on October 7<sup>th</sup>.**

**David from the Rescue Mission spoke, but he kept it very short, because he would like more of our community members present. He will try and be at our next meeting, on October 20<sup>th</sup>.**

**The following are Elvi-Gray Jackson notes:**

- **Eliminated both AWWU and ML&P Board of Directors form of governing. An Advisory Board for both has been re-established.**

- **Public Safety Committee will discuss revisiting the Fireworks ordinance at its next meeting on October 12<sup>th</sup>.**
- **Plumbers Union Contract affecting mostly AWWU water treatment employees went all the way to Arbitration. Arbitrator ruled in two areas for the MOA and one area for the Union relating to compensation. MOA filed for a court injunction to prevent a strike. Judge decision will be made on November 10<sup>th</sup>. Assembly met in a special session last week to clarify its intentions regarding labor negotiation guidelines.**
- **Parking Authority ordinance delegating authority to write tickets in the downtown area passed.**
- **Boards and Commission ordinance revamped with sunset clauses. Many will have to be reviewed by the Internal Auditor prior to Assembly re-establishing existence. Budget Advisory Commission and School Budget Advisory Commission is now one.**
- **Public Hearing held on Tuesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> regarding protective measures in response to criminally offensive sexual behavior – Taxi Cab Ordinance but relates to all those who have Chauffer’s licenses. Public Hearing continued to meeting of 9/27 and is scheduled to go before the Public Safety Advisory Commission for review prior.**
- **Administration provided a 2012 preliminary budget which provides the amount of taxes we can collect - \$229,608,471. 2011 taxes that could have been collected - \$232,120,199. Amount actually collected based on budget cuts was \$225,307,034.**
- **Assembly will receive the 2012 budget by October 1<sup>st</sup>. Work session and hearings will be scheduled.**
