Subject: Federation of Councils Funding 2011

We are writing you as delegates to the Federation of Community Councils regarding our Budget for the year 2011. It is our understanding from Chair Traini that we have been Assembly Budgeted for \$30,000 for the 12 Month period of operation beginning January 1, 2011, ending December 31, 2011.

We are submitting the amounts funded from the beginning of Federation Operations from 1979 through 2010, as per EXHIBIT "A" which also reflects the inflation percentage for the same period.

We request that the Assembly fund **at least** the amount of \$98,000 for the year 2011. The Federation has consistently operated on a cost efficient basis as per the exhibits and should not be penalized for such.

During the past years each and every Assembly and Mayor has recognized the important function of the FCC and has funded it at a level to provide those services.

We have gained efficiencies over the years and continue to do so. We are reaching a funding level below which the services of the Federation will not be able to serve the councils and the Citizens of Anchorage. We would hope that an office independent of Politics can be maintained.
