Pre-filed Bills for the 31st Legislature — My office recently pre-filed legislation, including:

- House Bill 21 CONTRACEPTIVES COVERAGE:INSURE;MED ASSIST: House Bill 21 requires health care
 insurers, including Medicaid services, to provide coverage for prescription contraceptives and medical
 services necessary for those products or devices. HB 21 gives women full access to the contraceptive
 method that works best for her—including long-acting reversible contraceptives (LARCs) such as
 intrauterine devices and implants—without barriers related to cost or availability. HB 21 also requires
 coverage for the dispensing of 12 months of prescriptive contraceptives at a time.
- House Joint Resolution 2 CONST. AM: 90 DAY REGULAR SESSION: House Joint Resolution 2 amends the Constitution of the State of Alaska to limit the length of legislative sessions to 90 days. The resolution aligns the Constitution with the statutory limit passed by voters in a 2006 ballot initiative limiting the Legislature to 90 day sessions. The variation between state statute and the constitution creates inconsistency in the law governing the length of regular sessions. Since 2008, when the ballot initiative took effect, the Legislature has only met the statutory 90-day limit four times. In 2010, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018 the Legislature ran past the statutory limit, incurring cumulative costs to the state of more than \$1,000,000.
- Marriage Defense & Sex Offender Registration: This bill eliminates marriage as a defense in specific sexual assaults and also updates the sex offender registration requirements to include out-of-state convictions for sexual offenses.

Anchorage Airport Update January 2019

- ANC North/South Runway Renewal Project: Project involves rehabilitating and widening RW 15/33 (the north/south runway), and updating taxiway geometry to meet FAA standards through the summers of 2018 and 2019.
 - **a.** The 2018 runway construction is now complete. The North/South Runway resumed normal operations and will remain open throughout the winter.
 - b. Construction will recommence in April 2019, requiring all aircraft to be shifted to the east-west runways.
 - c. To stay up to date on the project and to submit comments, visit the website at anc15-33.com.
- 2. **Terminal Concessions**: David Green Group will be opening a specialty retail concept in Concourse C near gate C4. They are temporarily occupying the former Brookstone space in Concourse C featuring KUHL merchandise.
- 3. **Ted Stevens Commemorative Exhibit:** Installation by the Ted Stevens Foundation is underway. Memorial is located at the start of Concourse C in the secure area, and will feature a bronzed statue of Senator Stevens to accompany an upgraded seating area.
- **4. Storm Water Permit Review:** ANC expects ADEC to release the draft ANC Storm Water Permit for a 60 day public notice for public comment in January. A public hearing is likely to be held some time in February.
- 5. Lake Hood Seaplane Base:
 - **a. Frozen Lakes:** Winter operations are in effect, and we are requesting everyone's help to spread the reminder to please stay off the ice. The frozen lakes remain restricted active runway surfaces all winter long for ski operations. For further information please contact the Lake Hood Office at 907-266-2410.
 - **b. Pesticide Permit:** The airport is working to get its own pesticide permit to apply herbicide to the lakes for weed control this summer. We anticipate a public notice period in late January or February.
- **6. Anchorage Transportation Fair:** Airport construction projects will be represented at the fair being held February 6th from 3-7pm at the Alaska Airlines Center, 3550 Providence Drive. <u>Anchoragetranspofair.blogspot.com.</u>
