DRAFT Turnagain Community Council Minutes
Meeting Summary December 7, 2006

- I. **Community Police Report.** Sargent Cindi Stanton discussed the police academy, citizen's academy training, gang information briefing, and calls for service in the Turnagain area.
- II. **Legislative Report.** Rep-elect Lindsey Holmes introduced her new staff and explained that the new session would begin on January 16. The shorter legislative sessions approved by the voters do not take effect until 2008.
- III. **Stevens International Airport Master Plan.** Linda Bustamente discussed the A/B Concourse remodel for seismic safety work. Rich Wilson and Eric Murachery presented on the Airport's process for updating the airport master plan. Cathy Gleason and Mark Wiggin expressed concern that the community council did not have representation on the technical advisory committee for the master plan and that mass community call-out meetings were not effective ways to focus community input into the master plan process.
- IV. **Athenium School.** Tracey Perry and an Athenium high school senior presented.
- V. **35th & McRae Neighbors Redesign.** Glenn Preston presented the residents' November 8 recommendation to the Municipality on Neighbors redesign of the road improvement project.
- VI. **Web-Access to State and Municipal Information.** Allison Biastock from Sen. Hollis French's office gave an informative presentation on the Legislative web resources for tracking legislation and providing input in the legislative process. Fred Carpenter and Terry Monigan gave a presentation on the municipalities My Neighborhood online information services.
- VII. **PS10 Traffic Resolution Reconsideration.** Mark Wiggin lead a discussion of the PS10 Traffic Resolution from the November meeting. A written draft of the resolution was presented for discussion. After a lengthy discussion, Keith Wiger moved to approve the draft motion. Breck Tostevin requested that two friendly amendments be made to the motion. The friendly amendments were agreed to. The first was to confirm the vote numbers to the minutes. The second was to remove the term "one-way" from the 2nd resolve sentence so that the resolution requested "establishing a loop route" to avoid impacts on any one street. The amended motion passed by a vote of 22 to 0.
- VIII. **Turnagain Elementary School Donation.** Mark Wiggin moved to donate \$250 to Turnagain Elementary School for student snacks as a thank you for allowing the TCC to meet in its Library. The motion was adopted unanimously.
