DOWNTOWN ANCHORAGE CORE STREETS DESIGN CONCEPTS

What used to be the **E Street Corridor Project** has now been expanded to include more of the Downtown core streets – the 16 square block area bounded by 3 /7 Avenues and C/G Streets. The group in charge of the project – **MAKERS architecture and urban design**, CRW Engineering, and Earthscape – **will be in town next week for two public meetings.**

The first meeting is an open house that will provide participants with an opportunity to review and comment on streetscape design options for the Downtown core that will allow participants to review design concepts and ask questions of the consultant team. **MAKERS** also will provide a short presentation that reviews the concepts, summarize comments from the open house, and discuss next steps.

The first meeting takes place on Wednesday, August 23 from 6:30 - 8:00 pm at City Hall in Room 155.

The second meeting will be an "open door" session on Thursday, August 24 from 9:00am - 12:00 noon. This session is a chance for individuals to meet one-on-one with the MAKERS team and work collaboratively through some of your issues. **MAKERS** will have drawings on the table and pens available to develop the ideas into images. The "open door" session will be held in City Hall, Room 160.

Over the next several weeks the team will refine the design concepts for Downtown core streets based on the input they receive at either of these two public meetings, so your participation is extremely important as it will help ensure the creation of a public asset reflective of the goals and vision of Anchorage citizens.

- Take one of the guided Captain Cook Interpretive Walking Tours with Amber Rose, National Park Service education specialist with the APLIC. You will learn things you never imagined regarding Cook's exploration of this area of Alaska. Tours begin at 11 am and 2:30 pm.
