

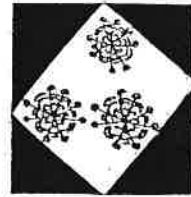

Christmas Tree Recycling in Anchorage, Eagle River and Palmer/Wasilla

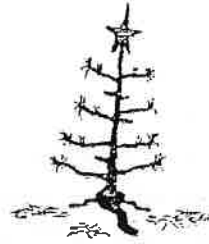

BARE TREES ONLY: Please make sure your tree is a **BARE trees – no plastic bags, no ornaments, no lights, no tree stands!** Tinsel is the only thing that can be left on the tree. There is no fee to drop off a Christmas tree for recycling – **IT'S FREE!** Each CARRS store (except Wasilla will have a **designated area in the parking lot** to drop off. Boy Scout Troops 168 & 286 will pick-up your tree for small donation – Call 868-5058
