ANCHORAGE LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN

You are cordially invited to attend the Open House public meeting for the Anchorage Long-Range Transportation Plan. Your participation is important to us, and we would like to hear from you! The Anchorage Metropolitan Area Transportation Solutions (AMATS) and the Alaska Department of Transportation and Public Facilities are sponsoring development of TransVision, a Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) for Anchorage that provides strategies for transportation improvements and investments. Join the project team for an Open House on Tuesday, April 13 from 5:30pm-9:30pm at the Loussac Library Assembly Foyer on the lower level. You will have the opportunity to review displays on the LRTP system elements, a rolling slide show on the status of our existing system, talk directly with project representatives, and to provide your input on the projects and policies that will form the LRTP. ANCHORAGE TRAIL WATCH PROGRAM

The Anchorage Trail Watch program recruits trail users to help promote safety and to prevent crime on the Anchorage trail system. Volunteers receive safety training, carry cell phones to report suspicious activity, post incident reports on the Trail Watch website and wear distinctive Trail Watch gear. Through this highly visible presence, crime is discouraged and residents feel safer as they use the trails to run, ski, walk their dogs, bike and commute to work. The Trail Watch program was developed in 2003 as a result of a series of community meetings and is based upon specific community recommendations. The program has already made an impact on the community and Trail Watch volunteers, easily identified by their bright green armbands, report receiving compliments and thank-you's from people they meet on the trails.

In addition, local businesses are donating resources to trail improvements. In 2004, Trail Watch donations will fund increased trail signage, mile markers, maps and a new Trail Watch Headquarters building to be located at Westchester Lagoon, the city's most popular trailhead. REBUILDING TOGETHER-VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

Rebuilding Together, formerly known as Christmas in May-Anchorage helps senior citizens, handicapped persons, and those with low income who own their own home but who, because of age, disability, or fixed income, are not able to cover the costs of home repair. Skilled and unskilled volunteers in the Anchorage community perform the work which can include painting, plumbing, carpentry, roofing, electrical work, etc. Projects accepted for the program are one-day work projects for most volunteers.
