

November Meeting 2004 Minutes

Call to order at 7:15 P.M. Paul Polansky and 2nd by Kep Pierce moved the Treasure's report for October revision, it passed. Fred Schiner and 2nd by Paul Polansky moved the Treasure's report for November, it passed. The September and October Paul Polansky and 2nd by Fred Schiner moved Minutes. November Agenda was revised and was moved by Paul Polansky, 2nd by Fred Schiner, it passed.

Kep Pierce talked to the body for support to the Federation of Councils for their budget from the assembly. She asked that people would attend the Assembly budget meeting to show support for them. She talked about the materials in which the Federation helps the councils, mail-outs, copying.

Allen Tesche was unable to attend but Gene Storm was in his place and mentioned briefly about the budget. He also asked by Kerry Hawkins to let Mr. Tesche know to increase funding for more C.S.O.'s. This was in response due to the amount of increase of junk vehicles in the neighborhood since September when funds ran out.

Rick Henderson talked about their Neewollah activities. He also mentioned upcoming Thanksgiving events at the center, a community dinner and a Thanksgiving meal handout for those who needed and couldn't afford it. He mentioned the closure of the center for the holidays. Nov. would be closed on Thanksgiving, December they will be closed on Dec. 24th, DEC. 25th, Dec. 31st and Jan 1st.

Fundraising report was that the holiday crafts show was cancelled due to lack of interest and that sales for the Mr. Whitekeys "Fly By Night" were going to be on sale until the 20th of November.

No reports were given from Zoning or Patrol.

Carolyn Keneen from Mountain View Main Street spoke. To members with the plans and direction that "main street" has been working on. The area was disclosed as being Mountain View Drive from Taylor to Hoyt. She mentioned the need for a bank as well as few more retail outlets. She and Angela Jimenez will keep us updated.

Sergeant Allen spoke with great news!!! He told us that the crime rate for Mountain View was one of the lowest in the city!!!!!! He mentioned as well that A.P.D. have been doing less knock and talks with calls about drugs. This is due to the amount of "meth" labs that have been found and the calls are being referred to metro division.

Lisa Mills spoke about the continuation of block grant monies for those who want to spruce up their block. So far the participation is very poor. (We need to help her out here.) She is also trying to gain interest in a monthly meeting in regards to various needs in the community.

Street maintenance made a brief stop-in. The supervisor for the north side of town wanted to let us know that they would be in more detail and further discussion in December. Kerry Hawkins asked him about the removal of snow from the alleys, they were going to try and remove it at the same time as the streets.

In new business an advisory vote was taken in regards to the new alcohol permit for "Noble's Diner". With a discussion it was approved with more details in December. It was also noted that the council should send notice to the city in regards of more time to discuss this matter instead of a few days to determine.
