ELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR NORTHEAST COMMUNITY COUNCIL –

NECC Member Lori Johnston – gave report that currently the MOA and the State of Alaska do not have plan or contingency analysis in place for a Nuclear Attack. Motion made and passed as follows:

NECC request the Municipality of Anchorage Assemblmembers ask the Office of Emergency Management to develop a plan for the evacuation for Anchorage in the event of a nuclear strike and post-strike with plans, procedures, maps and guidelines for survivors. Motion passed unanimously.

MOA 2003-064 – change Karluk Street from Class 1 Residential Collector to a Class 1C Neighborhood Collector. No action taken.

MOA 2003-062 – change in Municipal Ordinance 21.15.005E requiring Dept. of Planning and Development provide Notice of Public Hearing by mailing to property owners within 1000 of land subject to an application for variances, conditional uses, subdivision approval, and other special land use permits from the current 500 feet. Motion carried.

Planning Dept. S11071- Towne East Sediton/Port Commons -Port Commons Short Plat Consideration.- The following motion was made and carried.r
“ The Northeast Community Council takes a position of objection that the project known as “Port Commons” be denied a short plat and further that all egress/ingress traffic from this project align with existing streets.”
