A new "Food for Thought" pilot program has the potential of educating families about nutrition and feeding needy children.

An agreement between the Department of Health and Human Services' Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program and the Anchorage Libraries Youth Services now allows WIC participants to read a reserved list of children's books about good nutrition at the Muldoon Branch Library. Then, after filling out a questionnaire on the book, the WIC participants can receive food vouchers through the mail.

Usually, WIC participants have to pick up their food vouchers at one of the four MOA-wide WIC offices, after having a one-on-one nutrition lesson.

The new mail voucher program should free up some of the program's nutrition counselors, so they can provide other services to clients.

Nearly \$1 million a year goes to low income infants, children and breastfeeding women to ensure they receive enough protein, calcium and vitamins in their diets.
