Develop a new Pocket Park in the Reka area, 6. Complete Williwaw Park Phase II, 7. Street lighting for area around Williwaw Elementary, 8. Pedestrian Improvements for South Boniface, 9. Russian Jack Areawide Traffic Calming Study, 10. Continue Russian Jack Spring Park Master Plan improvements. The unranked 2003 list from the MOA is as follows: Boniface Parkway Surface Rehab – Debarr Road to Tudor Road, Bragaw Surface Rehab – Glenn Hwy to Debarr Road, Chester Creek Trail connection Tudor Road Crossing to Goose Lake, Pine Street/McCarry St Surface Rehab – Mt View Drive to Debarr Road, Russian Jack Area Park Acquistion, Russian Jack Springs Irrigation, Russian Jack Springs Park at Reka Drive, Traffic Calming and Safety Improvements.



In Time of Need - A People's Forum - Anchorage March 7-8, 2003

With the country at Code Orange and close to war with Iraq, it seems timely that the following emergency preparation workshop (designed for natural or human caused disasters) is coming shortly to Anchorage. Expect the series "In Time of Need – A People's Forum," speakers and material to be "well-honed" by the time it reaches Anchorage after a journey to Juneau (Jan. 24-25), Fairbanks (Feb. 7-8), and Kenai (Feb. 21-22).

Not to over-emphasize conflict – speakers recognize that earthquake, fire, avalanche, getting lost in the hills, or even frozen pipes are more likely to befall the average Alaskan family. Nevertheless, the lessons of preparedness have broad application!

While Keynote speaker, Dr. Picou associated with the Cordova community following the Exxon Valdez Oil spill, will address some of the social ramifications of disasters, a Friday evening armchair panel (Michael Carey, Roman Dial, Larry Merculief, & Chris Kiana) will ponder human and traditional resourcefulness. The Saturday program "fires up" with "Scared Scriptless" improvisations before stacking up a rich assortment of film, feature and standing advice on topics including shelter, energy, food and water – emergency planning and how best to protect children during difficult times. The Share Fair connects attendees with an array of agencies and groups who bring wide experience to the table – perhaps offering opportunities for members of the community to find their place in the larger scheme of things.
