

Minutes for Approval from 12/12/02 Meeting:

The President called the meeting to order at 7:37 P.M. The Agenda was presented and approved. The Secretary read the minutes from the November 14th meeting. Motion was made to amend the minutes to include the mentioning of an alternate corridor along Minnesota for the Chugach Electric high voltage transmission line. Motion seconded and approved. After addition, Secretary's minutes were approved. The Vice-President discussed the interrelationship between the Taku Campbell Community Council and the Federation of Community Councils as well as the current survey of members being undertaken by TCCC. The Public Outreach Liaison discussed her duties, the TCCC monthly newsletter and the possible neighborhoods' information and warning systems. The Community Development Chair discussed Carrs/Safeway move to Abbott Road and the possible error in counting some 900 people in the last census. The President cited TCCC's need to discuss the new construction of a Chugach Electric High Voltage transmission line. In order to discuss the matter he asked for a motion to approve the concept as presented at our last TCCC meeting. Rebecca Roberts so moved and Carol Holden seconded. Discussion followed. Rebecca Roberts moved to table the motion until TCCC's January 9, 2003, meeting, seconded by Ron Jordan. Tabling motion approved unanimously. Assemblyman Doug Van Etten joined in the discussion. Glen Cravez, Project Manager for Alaska 20/20 spoke about the project, the sources of funds and the hopeful likelihood for continuation of it. Beth Pozzi, Nerland Agency, Harold Henderson, Project Engineer, DOT, and Mitch Martin, Wilder Construction, spoke about the C Street improvement project. Members present were concerned mostly about the lack of trees, aesthetics, sound barrier and durability of walls to be erected along C Street.

HIGH SCHOOL BOUNDARY CHANGES

Construction of the new South Anchorage High School on Elmore Road is on schedule. When the school opens, crowding at Dimond and Service High Schools will be eased and our south Anchorage high schools will become the smaller, more personable schools the community has requested. Opening this brand new high school means the school board will have to re-draw boundaries for high schools.

A task force made up of students, parents and school administrators is meeting weekly to review some possible scenarios. The group has set enrollment targets for the Dimond, Service and New South Anchorage high schools. These targets will enable them to recommend boundary shifts that will fill these schools to roughly 90% of their capacity - allowing for future growth in South Anchorage. At this point, it doesn't appear the changes will impact West, Bartlett or East high school attendance areas. The task force will make its recommendation to me in February and I will review it and make a recommendation to the School Board. The School Board will hold two public hearings and make a decision in March. For more information, reference http://www.asdk12.org.
