Meeting called to order by Chair Al Tamagni, Sr. @ 7:05  
Officers present included: Al Tamagni, Charisse Millett vice chair, Lynda Zaugg sec.

Wende Wilber of CRW Engineers provided an update on road projects. Discussion re 72<sup>nd</sup>, Spruce to Lore and on to 80<sup>th</sup>. Flyers were handed out and Co. advised that a mailer would be coming out re public meetings on the above. They are trying to do a joint public meeting rather than 2 separate meetings. Earliest const can happen is 2008. Plan is to have a sidewalk on one side and make a multi use path on the other side. 72<sup>nd</sup> and 80<sup>th</sup> are both state collector roads. The city will take ownership of the roads once they are upgraded. Question re utilities? Response – just starting to scope re the location or even underground. 80<sup>th</sup> may be first. New light will be going in at 72<sup>nd</sup>. 80<sup>th</sup> will need about 8 million and Lore about 12 million.

Kelly Suchodolski of Dowl Engineers announced public meeting #2 will be next Monday at Wendler. The formal presentation will run from 6:30 to 7. Abbott Loop ext. should be completed 8/07. Dowling to be completed in 08.

Mike Gault of DOT reported that the water lines, the largest part of the project are for the most part in the ground. 68<sup>th</sup> will be open for regular traffic on Friday.

Sgt. Cindi Stanton of APD reported that calls for service in the Comm. Co area were down with the exception of DWI arrests which went up this month to 5 arrests. Chipwood residents have formed a new neighbor watch.

Shawna Popovici from Muni Parks & Rec. is in charge of the 11/12 community parks in this area. She indicated a task force for Meadow Park (off 68<sup>th</sup>) has been established for a community visioning project. Once folk determine what they would like to see in their park it will be forwarded to the Parks master plan. Meadow Park has already had it's first meeting – more to come. Small discussion re signs, need for warning signs.

Michael Weston from AFD. Anch Fire Dept will be holding an open house Wed. at the new station at Tutor and McLane. Public is very welcome. Also the Dept is looking at expanding Station 12.

Committee Reports: None

Certificate of Appreciation was presented by the Co. to Mike Gault of DOT for a great job he has done on our road const. projects.

Legislative candidates spoke for 5 min. each and then answered questions. Ralph Samules and Kevin Myers.

The Assembly report was provided by Dick Traine. He noted that the Muni Budget hearings have been going on for the past 3 weeks and he has seen about 8 people come forward to testify. He found that a bit concerning! This is the 1<sup>st</sup> 2 year budget cycle and they are working with a continuation budget this year. Next year they will be building a new budget. He talked about wanting to build a road through to Bragaw. He indicated we could expect a discussion re transmission lines for elec. There is currently a 90 ft tower on Lake Otis which some folks are not pleased with so consideration is being given to reducing the size limit to 70 ft. He would like community co comments and requests people contact him. Title 21 is about 1 year away from completion.
