A	(2) 6FT Wood and Steel Park Bench
B	(1) Solid Steel Round Picnic Table
C	(1) ADA (Americans with Disabilities) Solid Steel Round Picnic Table
D	New dog waste station
E	New float-plane-themed bike racks (one already donated by Cook Inlet Housing)
F	Bear resistant trash container* *may be provided by MOA Parks Dept

Please note: exact placement of features may change slightly

Longer-Term Vision:

1	Interpretative signs with park history, 3 benches facing lake.
2	Inclusive/ADA playground, shaped like or made of a small plane fuselage, backless bench for observing
3	Picnic area with multiple tables, including an inclusive/ADA tables
4	Relocate Muni park sign from middle of park.
5	Install new inclusive swing set and install backless benches for observing.
6	Remove or relocate existing kiosk and dog waste station from middle of park.
