Whereas MOA Home rule Charter dated 9-16-1975 "the term dedicated is intended to indicate formal designation of the land in question for permanent or long term park or recreational purposes".

Whereas the parks within our boundaries of the Community Council should be dedicated as proposed as PR land as listed below,

## OSOVCC Park Land for designation:

- Oceanview Bluff Park 13370 Reef Place, established in 1982 from state grants Total property 66 acres.
- Oceanview Park, 13420 Jarvi/1200 Oceanview Dr., established 1976 from HCRS Bonds and LWCF monies. 7.07 acres, received Park Foundation money 2013
- Johns Park, 700 Tomasson Dr./145 Bree Ave, established 1973, 58.75 acres, received Park Foundation money 2008
- Stephenson Park, 13024 Stephenson St, established 1980 from former water well site, size 1.35 acres, received Park Foundation money 2013
- Hamilton Park, 13253 Elmhurst Dr., purchased in 1974 developed with LWCF monies, ADA compliant with equipment, 1.69 acres
- Mariner Park, 12613 Mariner/12619 Johns Rd, established by patent in 1978, 4.52 acres, along Furrow Creek, open space
- Old Seward Highway Buffer Park, Old Seward Hwy and Brandon, acquired in 1982 1.69 acres, open space
- · Mesa Verde Park, received by patent in 1978 as a former well site, 1.68 acres open space

## Other parks that borders OSOVCC:

- South Anchorage Sports Park, 779 W. Klatt Rd/769 W. Klatt Rd, established in 1997, 65 acres
- South Anchorage Park, O'Malley Road/C St., established in 1991 transferred from Heritage Land, 70 acres

Tanglewood Park, New Seward and Hawkins Lane, wetland preservation acquired Greatland Trust, 41.1 acres
