### E. Government Updates (5 minutes each)

- 1. Office of the Mayor Portia Erickson and Junior Aumavae (Chief Equity Officer) Apply on-line for Boards and Commission positions. Upcoming community events include the Winter Solstice Festival at Cuddy Park, City of a Million Lights (on Facebook page of Easy Park). Mayor's top legislative priority is to fund improvements to the Port of Alaska.
- **2. Assembly –** Suzanne LaFrance, Chair

**Homelessness Taskforce** continuing to work on strategies for Mass Care facilities. The 2022 budget passed unanimously on November 23<sup>rd</sup>. On December 9<sup>th</sup> some of the Mayor's vetoes were overridden. Working on some small updates to our Municipal election laws. Working on updates for Rules and Procedures for Assembly meetings.

3. Anchorage School Board – Dora Wilson, School Board member A two-year bond will be put on the April 2022 ballot with 38 different school projects. Seeking new superintendent. Budget process.

#### 4. Office of the Alaska Governor -

#### F. Presentations:

- 1. Noisy Vehicles and the Law Darrel Hess, Municipal Ombudsman and Hans Thompson, South Addition CC member Hans collected signatures of people that were disturbed by noisy vehicles. Public upset because there is very little enforcement of the existing code. Darrel calls it an "epidemic" of noise. He states that current code is not enforceable. Some of the noise is due to older "beat up" vehicles, some of it is due to people choosing to make their vehicles noisy. South Addition CC has created a sample resolution to ask the administration to update rewrite the code and then enforce it. FCC has distributed a MS Word document of the suggested resolution for the consideration of councils.
- 2. Assembly Reapportionment Process Pete Peterson, Assembly member Federal Census each ten years. The Assembly received the demographic information from the Census and has set up a process to re-structure the Assembly districts so that they as close to equal in size as possible. There is an additional wrinkle to the process this time, in that Anchorage voters chose to add a 12<sup>th</sup> Assembly member by taking the five and a half districts that are currently in place (with eleven total Assembly members) and making six equal Assembly districts (with each having two Assembly members). Sample maps are on the Municipal website and the public is welcome to make their own map. <a href="www.reapportionANC.org">www.reapportionANC.org</a> The sample maps will be displayed in different public spots including City Hall and the Library.
- 3. Strategies for Mass Care John Weddleton, Assembly member Taking into account the plan for disbursing the homeless shelters throughout Anchorage, the task force has committed to create a 120 person medical convalescence shelter in the Sockeye Hotel on "C" Street and Fireweed Lane, a 120 person workforce and supportive housing facility at the Barratt Hotel on Spenard Road, a 200 person (with surge capacity up to 300) single adult facility with navigation, a special needs facility at a location to be determined in the future, and a substance misuse treatment facility at the Salvation Army location at 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue and the Seward Highway.
- 4. Proposed Changes to Municipal Title 21 Fee Structure Paul Hatcher and Dave Whitfield, Municipal Planning Department Proposed fee structure for services should be more clear and precise. Some fees will be reduced.
