7:00 pm	<ul> <li>Welcome/Call to Order</li> <li>Lindsey Hajduk led an orientation to Zoom.</li> <li>Consent Agenda (minutes from previous meeting on 01/05/2022, agenda for current meeting.)         <ul> <li>Motion: Irene Persson-Gamble moved to approve, Peggy Auth seconded. Consent agenda passes.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Hajduk reviewed the agenda and introduced the executive board.</li> </ul>
7:10 pm	Assembly Report, Kameron Perez-Verdia: Directed attendees to review reapportionment documents on assembly website. Noted that the assembly will be hosting public hearings on February 24 and March 1 and encouraged community feedback. Shared update on transitional housing plan. Noted that assembly has approved a new police chief. Provided update on bond which includes Spenard projects.      Preskitt: Inquired about staffing plan for transitional housing properties.      Perez-Verdia: Noted that a Request for Proposals (RFPs) will go out and housing will be staffed by community organizations (not municipality.)      Mielke: Voiced question from chat from Grant Kinney inquiring if alcohol tax is funding any items outlined in homelessness report.      Perez-Verdia: Clarified that at this time that was not a funding source, rather they are using COVID funds.      Mielke: Voiced question from chat from Margaret McDonagh inquiring if reapportionment could adjust community council boundaries.      Perez-Verdia: Noted that it is possible, noted that he does not think it will change SCC's boundaries particularly.      Hajduk: Shared that she had asked this question at previous town hall meetings, noted that the answer was that potentially the CC boundaries could change further down the road, but nothing in the current reapportionment process outlines remapping community councils at this time.

- Tahnee Seccareccia: Inquired about difficult working relationship between Assembly and Mayor's Office and if there has been progress.
- Perez-Verdia: Shared that personally, getting information from the administration has been a challenge, but noted that outlook can depend on topic (some working well and others not.)

- Anchorage School Board Report, Margo Bellamy: Shared that countdown to kindergarten has begun (lots of opportunities for parents to attend virtual meetings) as well as lotteries for charter schools (virtual presentations rather than in person visits to schools and charter school fair on 2/19.) Noted that parent-teacher conferences are upcoming on 2/16-/217. Shared summary of bond (\$111 million).

- Airport Report, John Johansen: Seeking input on community plan. Encouraged use of cell phone parking lot and disuse of Lake Hood Seaplane Base.
  - Peggy: Inquired if there was an acting airport manager.
    - Johansen: Shared that John Binder will be acting.
  - Jed Smith: Inquired if the airport is managing taxi que line. Shared difficulties with catching a cab (in terms of disorganization of cabs and passengers.)
    - Johnasen: Noted that it is not managed 24 hours a day but there is a more limited basis of management, noted that he will pass concerns along to operations manager.

  - Bob Auth: Clarified part of road is from Minnesota to Benson; noted that other parts
    of the road have been redone already with similar visions. Noted that goal is
    consistency with work already completed and to be proactive regarding residential
    developments occurring in future.
  - Hajduk: Reminded attendees of previous presentation highlighting 3 main options; noted that letter does not select a specific option but rather preferred features.
     Noted that individuals are encouraged to still submit comments on spenardroad.com and that it was timely for the SCC to submit comments.
  - Seccareccia: Noted that there were a lot of forward-thinking conversations and a lot of work that was integrated into this document.
  - Cheryl Lovegreen: Thanked committee for thorough work.
  - Daniel McKenna-Foster: Introduced self as muni employee but clarified he is speaking as a private Spenard resident. Thanked members for their work and reminded attendees to continue to advocate for what they want to see based on community goals.
