Community Concerns

- Stu-Doon Dangler issues: People Mover has been taking responsibility for the ones next
 to the bus stops, but not the other ones. Will need to be addressed between now and
 November. May not be large enough for CIP, Donna shared map of ownership for the
 areas where the Danglers hang.
- Stu-Homeless camps in Centennial Park, mattress fortress in park now
- Rick-Profits from oil companies was significant last quarter, need people in legislature to do something about it.
- State Redistricting-Lawsuit regarding the pairing of some parts of the NECC area, went
 to the superior court. Conclusions from the court; touching parts were okay, not enough
 input from public, and the pairing constituted unequal representation from the area and
 is now moving to the supreme court in Alaska. Northern parts of NECC is unsure where
 it will be now. "Intentionally discriminated against the residents of East Anchorage" and
 the board found cause in that. NECC did submit a resolution against the way East
 Anchorage was redistricted

- Just met with the incoming traffic commissioner and got a maintenance from 2002 in regard to the Muldoon road and wall. South of DeBarr is Muni's responsibility. Will call into DOT regarding the expiration of the agreement later this year and will also find out more about North Muldoon maintenance.
- Oil profits- per report almost 15 consecutive years Alaska is the most profitable oil sector in the world. Alaska has a large loophole in their corporate taxes and companies like Hill Corp pay zero dollars corporate taxes. Oil used to find 85% of our revenue, and now it is 15-20% of revenue.
- Mayor was in Juneau last week asking for money for port funding, a significant amount of money is being asked. The port provides 90% of supplies to the state.
- Sent a letter to JBER regarding property swap, heard from that JBER had received it and will get back to him.
- Bill to increase property tax exemption from \$50,000 to \$75,000. Property taxes
 in East Anchorage went up the most. This in the future will shift the burden from
 businesses to property owners.

Assembly Report:

Assemblyperson Dunbar and Petersen:

- Passed titles 21 (planning and zoning) and 23 (building code) reform, a lot of work done to make them non-controversial.
- Accessory dwelling units and make them tax free for 10 years. Was delayed due to concerns from Girdwood and their short term rentals.
- Reapportionment, district 1 will have to double in size due to ballot measure.
 There shouldn't be a big impact on the NECC, Turpin area in 2/4 maps would be returned to the east Anchorage area.
