AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY TO SUBMIT TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE A BALLOT PROPOSITION THAT WOULD INCREASE THE RESIDENTIAL REAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2023, AND UPON VOTER APPROVAL AND RATIFICATION, AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 12.15.015 ACCORDINGLY.





Why is this on the ballot?

- House Bill 411 became law July 11, 2022 with effective date October 9, 2022
- Enabled Alaska communities to increase residential real property tax exemptions from \$50,000 to \$75,000
- Alaska Statute 29.45.050(a) requires changes to the residential real property exemption to be approved by voters



What does it do?

- Increases percent of residential property value eligible for exemption from 20% to 40%
- From a max of \$50,000 to \$75,000
- Would go into effect January 1, <u>2023</u>



For example:

- Average price of single-family home is \$400,949
- Residential property with assessed value less than \$187,500 will see exemption double (40% = \$75,000)
- Residential property with assessed value greater than \$187,500 will receive maximum exemption of \$75,000
- Sponsors' intent to ensure that the benefit included those property owners at the margins



Your property valuation is your share of the cost of government

- Exemption shifts cost to commercial property owners
- Residential exemption was increased to 20% a few years ago (didn't require a vote because it was in the range the voters had already approved)
