#### Alaska Federation of Natives

Last month I had the privilege of attending the Elders and Youth segment of the annual Alaska Federation of Natives conference. The annual event brings together Alaska Native leaders, organizations, cultural performers, and advocates across Alaska. This year's conference theme was "Our Ways of Life" which is so fitting as indigenous voices from all corners of Alaska come together to discuss important issues affecting their communities.

## Korean Consulate

Met with Consul and Head of the Consulate, Park Joongsuk of the Republic of Korea on October 24th. I look forward to continuing our dialogue and expanding our support for one another through various initiatives. He shared his thanks for SB131 which I introduced during the last session to require education in the history and contributions of Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders in grades K-12.

#### Commemorative Event to Honor the African American Soldiers

In 2017, SB46 established October 25th of each year as *African American Soldiers' Contribution to Building the Alaska Highway Day*. On this day, African American Troops of the 93<sup>rd</sup> and 95<sup>th</sup> regiments constructing the Alaska-Canadian (ALCAN) highway north from Dawson Creek, met the white troops constructing the ALCAN Highway heading south. The Troops connected the two segments on October 25, 1943, at Contact Creek near Mile Post 490 in the Yukon Territory. I was honored to attend a celebration hosted by American Legion Post 34.

# Filipino American History Month

On July 20, 2023, HB23 was signed into law which established October as Filipino American History Month. The celebration coincided with a multimedia exhibit showcasing the stories and histories of Alaska's Filipino community which debuted on Saturday, October 28<sup>th</sup>. "Mana: The History We Inherit" is a collection of stories from Filipino elders living in Alaska. It includes portraits, photo archives and stories pulled from oral accounts gathered over the last year. I was also honored to attend this celebration.
