- I. Call to order John Thurber called the meeting to order at 7:02pm

- II. Standing Reports (15 minutes maximum)
 - A. Legislature: Representative Fields, & Senator Tobin
 - 1. Rep Fields: Next Wednesday (Dec 20th) there's a school bond fundraiser on Atwood Drive to support the school bond, our district has many schools on the bond. The Anchorage Assembly adopted the Park Foundation recommendations for the parks bond, which includes improving the playgrounds and trail connectivity around Eastchester. The gas supply shortage is something we're aware of, and looking to support grid resilience funding (GRIP funding, \$2.5 million match to federal funds) to invest in energy infrastructure reducing energy costs is important. Governor released his budget today, and anticipates it will change a lot as it moves through the legislative process. Is continuously reaching out to DOT/Muni to talk about snow clearing.
 - a) Question: Will imported natural gas raise costs? Yes, it would double costs for a lot of people's electric/heating bills.

 - 1. Dan Volland: the Anchorage Assembly has a meeting upcoming on Tuesday looking to pass a resolution to support the restoration of the Eklutna river, hopefully approving a new bargaining agreement with our police, will be discussing a possible renaming of the port, consideration of an ordinance for Assembly approval of the city's chief medical officer, two housing ordinances (both about 3-4 plex development, one for title 21 and one related to title 23).
 - a) Specifically regarding the 3-4 plex ordinance: I have heard from constituents wanting more time. The s version takes into account some fixes, and I will propose two amendments, including snow storage requirements and the other amendment concerns setbacks

based on structure size. The public hearing is going to be proposed to move to the second meeting of January, depending on a vote of the whole body.

- (1) Question: What action is going to be taken regarding Airbnb/short-term rentals? The action being taken by members Zaletel and Sulte will be taken up in January, and they're looking to register units and charge a fee, in addition to other things.
- (2) Question: What is going on downtown with the empty parking lots? We overhauled the downtown code and plan, which is aimed at creating more development. Surface parking is no longer an acceptable use in downtown.
