Minutes of the Tudor Area Community Council Sept. 6, 2007 Rogers Park Elementary School

Secretary Jacob Tuckerman called the meeting to order at 7:10 PM. (The council president and vice president had meetings at their children's schools.) There were five members and no guests attending. The council approved the minutes for the May 3, 2007, meeting without objection.

Scheduled speakers:

There were no assembly, police department, or Federation of Community Councils reports. One member said that the community still needs the emissions test that Assemblyman Traini wants to abolish.

Rep. Berta Gardner said that two cars had been stolen from Geneva Woods in the last two weeks. One car was found heavily damaged; the other car has not been found. She gave a brief report on the upcoming special session of the Alaska Legislature, which will deal with the Petroleum Production Tax passed last year and now under suspicion. Rep. Gardner's preference is for a straight gross revenues tax, primarily because of past and present problems with audits and legal challenges to a net profits tax.

Old Business:

<u>Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)</u>: Rep. Gardner said that the Capital Improvement Plan is an excellent method to get projects that the community council wants. Both the Municipal Assembly and the State Legislature use the CIP. It is much easier for legislators to get information on CIP projects than it is for them to get information on other projects. There was a short discussion on the completion date for the new Fire Station 4 construction. (Later info: Completion is scheduled for late December 2007 according to the EMT battalion chief.)

The council also discussed the delay on water main repairs on MacInnes St. at David Green Park. Mrs. Wick called the Muni in July and they responded by completing the repair work the next day.

<u>New Business</u>: <u>University Park</u> (carried over from May 2007 agenda): A member asked Dick Traini at the April council meeting how the University Park was protected from development. Mr. Traini advised that the council should find out how the park zoning was classified, with Public Lands and Institutions (PL&I) providing the highest zoning protection available. Rep. Gardner said she would try to find out the zoning classification.

There being no further business, the chair adjourned the meeting at 7:32 PM.
