

Minutes of Campbell Park Community Council
October 13, 2005

The meeting was called to order by Steve Johnston. The first order of business was to hold elections for officers. 21 people were in attendance.

Dick Traini nominated Dave Traver for President and the nominations were seconded. Voting was unanimous in favor.

Dick Traini nominated David Cummings for Vice President and the motion was seconded. Voting was unanimous in favor.

Dave Traver nominated Carolyn Mason as Secretary. The motion was seconded and voting was unanimous in favor.

Sandi Traini was nominated to be the Federation of Community Councils delegate by Mr. Terpak. Motion was seconded and voting was unanimous in favor.

The meeting was then turned over to Dave Traver to conduct.

Dick Traini reported on the Call of the Wild issue. Curt Nading claimed the operating conditions imposed on their liquor license were unfair. He was told by the liquor Board to go back to the community. Dick will attend the next ABC Board meeting. The Assembly has voted to place the restrictions; however the ABC Board did not attach the restrictions to the Call of the Wild liquor license. Johnny Ellis stated that they should have voted yes or no on the issue. Mr. Terpak stated that the property was up for sale by the Corporation owning the building and the land. Dick stated that the Assembly will not readdress the issue as it had made its stand clear.

Dick also reported that the Assembly had passed a resolution that a maximum of 3 packages of Sudafed could be purchased at one time. Sudafed is a prime ingredient in the illegal production of methamphetamine.

Dick reported that the viewing holes at the Fantasy Club would be sealed. Same restrictions are the 21 and under clubs.

The Municipality budget process is coming up. The mayor gave them a 2 year budget. The question was raised as to what 13 APD officers are doing in the Anchorage schools and why shouldn't they be put on the street.

The Long Range Transportation Plan calls for Bragaw to go through to Dowling.

Staffing at the assembly feeling is that it was a mistake to fire the staff member.

It was reported on what land was taken and what was put back for Simionean Little League. All of the land has now been replaced.

New Business: The homeless camp near Tudor and Lake Otis behind the Boys and Girls Club soccer fields was addressed. They are saying that it is private property and they have permission to stay there. More information is needed.

The APD Vice Unit was not taken over by the Rape Unit. Rape unit never existed. Special victims Units deals with Rape.

Brad Doggett from Dowl Engineers reported there would be a public Meeting on November 3 at Lake Otis Elementary probably at 7 pm. There is repaving this week on Tudor due to the traffic light being moved from Folker to Piper. Dowl is still looking for Citizen Advisory group members from our area, 2 or 3 people are needed. Michelle Goldstein will be on the Advisory Committee.

The State legislative report from Johnny Ellis and Berta Gardner was given by Senator Johnny Ellis. They have been touring the Seward Highway area to get a feel for the traffic problems. Materials are on the table for pick up. Senator Ellis will let us know when the next ABC Board meeting is and where it will be held.

Question was raised as to the platting on the Walmart Super Store. Has it gone thru?

No more new business. Meeting adjourned at 8:55 pm
