**In years past there has been a general tolerance of minimal ATV use. However, I must remind you that it is prohibited by Municipal Code to ride/drive non-street legal vehicles on public roads.**

**Residents are no longer tolerating the use of these ATV's as they are being operated recklessly, at late hours, violating private property, causing excessive dust and tearing up such areas as parkland and the newly created Adopt-A-Garden on Heights Hill—intentionally! There is now an active campaign to have ATV riders cited if caught in BV.**
