Honorable Governor Parnell and Ms. Rehfield,

As President of the Campbell Park Community Council I would like to express the Community Council's support for the projects that are priorities of the Community Council and Municipality of Anchorage. The capital budget currently includes:

- Bancroft Subdivision Area Road and Drainage Rehab - \$250,000
- Little Tree Drive/Cindylee Lane Area Road and Drainage Rehab -\$200,000
- Tudor Elementary School Technology, Books and Supplies Grant - \$31,800
- Campbell Park Community Council Safety Lighting - \$5000

The Bancroft subdivision neighborhood streets have suffered years of neglect and are deteriorating rapidly due to lack of adequate drainage. This project will construct drainage and roadway improvements. Funding is proposed as a 50/50 match of state grants and local road bonds. This project is both a safety and maintenance issue and is very important to the families in this neighborhood.

The Little Tree Drive/Cindylee Lane area road and drainage rehab will address road and drainage problems in a local neighborhood. These neighborhood roads have deteriorated due to inadequate drainage. This project will address these drainages issues and is priority for Municipal street maintenance, the neighborhood and the Community Council.

The Tudor Elementary School Technology, Books and Supplies Grant provides Tudor Elementary with funding to maintain and enhance classroom resources. Our Community Council meets in Tudor Elementary and many of children and grandchildren attend or have attended Tudor Elementary. We take special pride in our neighborhood school and see and appreciate these investments and improvements for our students and community school.

Campbell Park Community Council Safety Lighting is for the tunnel under Lake Otis just south of Waldron. The tunnel is often dark and filled with signs of gang activity. The CPCC feels that the addition of lighting will make it safe enough for families and to discourage those using the space to break the law.
