

## Mid-Hillside and Hillside East Community Council Joint Meeting

### Minutes January 19, 2012 Meeting

#### 7:00 Call to Order

- State Legislator's Report: No state legislature in attendance but Candidate for School Board, Tam Agosti-Gisler, spoke on the approaching school board election April 3<sup>rd</sup>
- Assembly Report: No Assembly person was in attendance
- Presidents, FCC Report, and Approval of Previous Meeting Minutes Discussed
  - Relocation of Frisbee Golf Course
  - FCC Revamping Website
  - Carol Comeau, School Superintendent attended
  - Marty Magee, MOA Assessor, reported that there are no large changes in property evaluations
- Title 21 Resolution: John Weddleton reported that there were changes added so all were being reviewed. Comments are due in Packet for Mayor by February 1<sup>st</sup>. Planning meeting is scheduled for the February 13<sup>th</sup>. Very little involves large lots. HALO submitted recommended changes to the Assembly.
  - Our Hillside Community Councils discussed and approved a Resolution Concerning Proposed Changes to Title 21 to submit to the Assembly (Resolution Attached)
- South High School Football Stadium Situation and Possible FCC Resolution: Background: Original School site plan stated not large enough for football field. South High Lobbied legislature for 2 years to get funds for field but failed to give neighborhood community council notice. City Planning Department approved change in site plan. At this writing Huffman Community Council does not support the change in site plan. Member of the South High School Football Booster club spoke at our meeting in support.
- MOA Community Needs Questionnaire: Lance Powell brought the Municipality's Consolidated Plan 2013-2017 Priorities Questionnaire. We answered as a group. Priority Need levels from unsure to high assigned for Special Needs-Subpopulations, Priority Housing Needs for Renters and Owners based on % of median income, Public Facilities, Infrastructure, Public Services and Economic Development.
