

**A RESOLUTION BY THE ABBOTT LOOP COMMUNITY COUNCIL  
IN SUPPORT OF REMOVAL OF CONTAMINATED SOIL INSIDE THE SLEDDING  
HILL AT SPRUCE PARK**

WHEREAS: In 2004 contaminated soil was encountered during construction of 84<sup>th</sup> avenue.

WHEREAS: In 2005 the MOA commissioned a report and work plan by Golder and Associates for disposal of the contaminated soil that included two options:

- 1) Remove the contaminated soil and dispose of at the Anchorage Municipal Landfill or
- 2) Construct a sledding hill using the contaminated soil, cap it with 2 feet of clean fill and maintain DEC mandated Institutional Controls consisting of biannual inspections at breakup and freeze up and submitting written reports every 2 years to the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation.

WHEREAS: In 2006 the MOA decided to go with option 2.

WHEREAS: The ALCC is concerned that the MOA has significant challenges meeting the Institutional Controls.

WHEREAS: The presence of contaminated soil in the sledding hill is not compatible with the community's full use and enjoyment of Spruce Park,

WHEREAS: The Abbott Loop Community Council approves of and supports removal and disposal of the contaminated soil in the sledding hill.

NOW BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, The Abbott Loop Community Council approves and supports requesting the MOA's concurrence and assistance in removing and disposing of the contaminated soil in the Spruce Park sledding hill.
