Dear Friends and Neighbors,

As we begin the second month of the 2022 legislative session, I want to give you an update on what is happening in the legislature, the progress of the bills we are working on, other important legislation, redistricting, and how all of this impacts our community.

# **Budget Update**

The governor's proposed <u>Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 budget</u> in large part provides flat funding for essential services and adds two dividend payments, including a supplemental 2021 payment of \$1,215 and a regular 2022 dividend of \$2,560. In total, this would cost the state around \$2.5 billion. For comparison, in 2021, the budget for all state services was \$4.3 billion. The governor has also proposed a general obligation bond (GO Bond) that would borrow up to \$310 million for capital improvement and infrastructure projects. This bond proposal would require voter approval and be on the 2022 state election ballot.

It is important to remember that although this year our state has benefited from unexpectedly high oil prices, strong stock market returns, and one time federal funds, we know all too well that the stock market and price of oil can be volatile. Without structural changes from the legislature and governor, we still are faced with a more than \$700 million annual deficit which further highlights the need for action.

# **Subcommittee Wrap Up**

In the Legislature, we are currently finishing the subcommittee process where we review each of the various state department budgets as proposed by the governor, hear from department leaders, and make changes to the proposed budget. Throughout the

process, I have offered a number of amendments that would help improve department performance and efficiency while reducing unnecessary spending.

### **State Revenue Forecast**

The <u>Fall 2021 Revenue Forecast</u> was released and includes the Department of Revenue's forecast for oil price and production as well as other sources of state revenue. This forecast has many key changes from last year's Spring forecast, including a \$75.72 Fiscal Year 2022 price per barrel of oil (a \$14.72 increase) and \$71 price per barrel (an increase of \$9) for Fiscal Year 2023. Projected production numbers are also notably higher, including a FY2022 increase of 27,100 barrels per day (up from 459,700 to 487,700) and 23,600 barrels per day increase for FY2023.

What does this mean for our budget? The Unrestricted General Fund (UGF) revenue forecast for FY 2022 has now increased by roughly \$1 billion and \$800 million for FY 2023

# **Redistricting Update**

The Alaska Redistricting Board has been faced with five lawsuits challenging their final map adopted at the end of 2021. These challenges include the South Muldoon and Eagle River senate pairing, the Mat-Su and Valdez house district, and two house districts in Southeast with Juneau and Skagway. The District Court reviewed these cases and has ordered the Alaska Redistricting Board to redraw the South Muldoon - Eagle River senate district and the two Juneau house districts. The court ruled against the Mat-Su challenge. These decisions will almost certainly be challenged and taken to the Alaska Supreme Court and a final or interim map is required by June 1st.

Of note in this case, the court found that the Redistricting Board failed to consider or make an effort to incorporate public testimony when drawing the Juneau house districts and East Anchorage Eagle River Senate district. If this decision is upheld by the state Supreme Court, it will play a major role in future redistricting processes.

The Juneau changes are not expected to impact Anchorage but, if affirmed by the Alaska Supreme Court, the ruling over the East Anchorage - Eagle River senate district would result in new senate pairings for Anchorage. It's not clear whether this will change our current senate district, but it is a real possibility.

**Updates on my Bills** (you can learn more and track the status of these bills with the links)

HB 227 Muni Energy Improvement Assessment Program: This bill builds on the success of the Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy (C-PACE) program by providing fixed-rate, long-term financing for energy efficiency and renewable energy projects is set to have its first hearing in the House Community and Regional Affairs Committee next week or two. This bill supports small businesses and workers, helps to grow our local and state economy, all while promoting energy resiliency and clean energy projects for our great state and local community.

HB 234 Political Contribution Limits: This bill would reinstate reasonable and constitutional political contribution limits. Last year, Alaska's contribution limits (that were enacted in 2006 through a citizens' initiative) were struck down by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals. This resulted in uncertainty and a risk of unlimited and outside funds flooding our state and local elections. HB 234 is quickly moving through the House and should be moving to the House Floor in the near future. So far, there have been three bill hearings in House State Affairs Committee which can be found here:

HB267 Ballot Curing: This bill would ensure eligible Alaskans who vote absentee have the opportunity to fix or "cure" their ballot if it is at risk of being rejected due to a minor error, such as a missing signature or date. HB 267 had its first hearing in the House State Affairs Committee earlier this month. You can find the committee hearing here.

# **Committee Update**

In the House Energy Special Committee which I chair, we have been hearing various bills, including <u>HB 299</u>, a proposal from the Governor to facilitate the implementation of small scale nuclear "micro reactors" to provide clean energy. These microreactors have many possible applications and could prove useful in providing clean heat and power, including in some of the remote areas in our state. Already, there are two projects that have come up, including one at Fort Eielson Air Force Base in Fairbanks, and one in Valdez. These would be the first micro-nuclear power systems in Alaska.

# **Property Tax Assessment Appeal Process**

We've been hearing concerns from community members that recent property tax appraisals have been shockingly higher than expected. If you or someone you know believes there may have been an error, you can find information on how to appeal the appraisal at <a href="mailto:muni.org/Departments/finance/property">muni.org/Departments/finance/property</a> appraisal.

The good news is that, this year, School Bond Debt Reimbursement from the state is expected to be fully funded. The governor's decision not to fund this obligation was the driving force behind high property taxes in recent years. Another positive note is that higher assessment values do not necessarily mean higher property taxes. The Assembly and mayor can still reduce the mil rate in a manner that takes into account the higher assessment values to keep taxes in line with past years.

#### **Homeowner Financial Relief Assistance**

Homeowners whose income was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic will soon be able to apply for financial relief to help pay for mortgages, property taxes, insurance, and even utilities. Pre-registration will begin February 28th.
