Approval of agenda: motion Carolyn, second Margo.

Elected officials' reports:

- Katy for Rep Mina: Discussed the BSA increase and legislative override of the Governor's veto during the special session in August; an increment to the budget for behavioral health supports; veto override of Senate Bill 183 so that the Dunleavy Administration Department of Revenue will comply with the state auditor; working with Department of Health on SNAP and Medicaid issues related to federal bills and the Rural Health Transformation Fund. Question about broad-based categorical eligibility and the state website being up to date.
- **Assembly Member Rivera:** Homelessness abatement and clean up actions, greenbelt especially use AncWorks to report; new contracts approved for shelters that will be smaller and not just in the winter; tax proposal on short-term rentals and a sales tax.

- Questions about different types of homeless camps, services offered to people when abated, and locations of camps.
- School Board Member Bellamy: welcome new principal at Airport Heights Elementary; new cell phone policy for classrooms; funding and retirement for teachers as legislative priorities; Accelerator program and rightsizing/consolidating to give kids more services; bargaining with AEA; new ASD website; parent-teacher conferences in October; volunteer with ASD. Question about the cell phone policy implementation across schools.
- **PTA Kate Yenik:** 70th Annual Halloween carnival October 25th (oldest carnival in Anchorage), major fundraiser to pay for field trips and ice rink; volunteer form for ASD; Friday Night Lights at the skating rink; donate to PTA.

Airport Heights Elementary School update - Principal Penney: In the district for 12 years as special education teacher, teacher expert, assistant principal prior; beginning of the year assessments and master schedule for holistic academic approach; Family night October 16th; attendance initiative; fundraising; Question about gardening activities and involving the students.

Transit Supportive Development Overlay (TSDO) - Daniel Mckenna-Foster: Implementing adopted plans; allowing new types of focused development to increase density and missing middle housing in central parts of Anchorage where infrastructure and services are already available; based on 2040 Land Use Map; in addition to the multifamily tax incentive bonus area the Assembly approved earlier this year; more restrictive code in 2014 impacted development; Mat-Su has seen an increase in residents; examples of what TSDO could look like; Right-of-Way Management Study coming up to discuss parking; going to Planning and Zoning Commission October 6 and then to Assembly. Questions/discussion about height restriction (35-45 feet, down from 75 originally), setbacks (none in current proposal), parking (Right-of-Way study), emergency access in winter, transit access for the neighborhood, concern about speeding, changing zoning across the entire Anchorage Bowl, tax abatement for 8 units or more, more public involvement.
