Assembly Report: (Next Meeting is May 10)

At the April 26th meeting, the Assembly approved the 1st Quarter Budget Revisions: Highlights follows:

- o \$1.07M for Vote by Mail Start-Costs which include equipment
- o \$425,000 to assist with Homelessness issues
- o \$250,000 Attorney Fees

Assembly approved amendments follows:

- \$5M property tax rebate depending on availability of funds on or after September 1, 2016 and no later than December 31, 2016
- \$51K for a Code Enforcement Officer to assist with the marijuana industry regulation.
- \$83K for an additional Fire Inspector
- \$75K to 4A's to provide housing support for 13 clients

The Assembly also set the 2016 Mill Levy as follows:

- ASD Mill Levy 6.73
- General Government Mill Levy 8.16
- Total Mill Levy 14.89
- Taxes on a \$350,000 home before exemptions \$5,211.50
- Taxes on a \$350,000 home after \$20,000 Residential Exemption \$4,913
- Taxes on a \$350,000 home after \$150,000 Senior Citizen or Disabled Veteran Exemption and \$20,000 Residential Exemption \$2,680
