- AWWU Resolution underwent a revision of the language and make a request from AWWU to present on the testing methods of fluoride in the water at the General meeting in December. The resolution is meant to discover whether or not testing is being conducted and what measurements are using.

Draft Design Workshop

Overlay zone design standards will be the series focus. The overlay zone would allow customizable adjustments to the municipal code to meet the needs of the Fairview. Form-based code overlay zone gives more flexibility to developers and land owners. These Fairview workshops would tackle how we want developers to proceed. We would like to have small groups of engaged neighbors improving our knowledge base and tackling issues. The first workshop will employ Legos to illustrate zoning and include collaborative activities. Allen Kemplen will lead but also look for help in putting together 1-2 first phase workshops that develop more concrete implementation of the Fairview Neighborhood plan. Engaging the Urban Design Commission and various groups such as AIA, ASLA, landscape architects and others with expertise would empower the group. Written reports and results from these design workshops will be shared with the public with in the intent to multiply public interest. Info on how to get involved will be distributed through FCC, social media, and possibly other means. InDesign experts that can volunteer their time are needed. Optimal start date hasn't been chosen, but will be in January.
