President's Report

Guest Presentations

Tom Dreyer on behalf of PIP Printing needs to expand their business from the 4 lots that are currently zoned R-O. Rezoning it from 25% business, 75% office/residential to 100% business or B-3 zoning. They do not plan on replatting the 4 parcels into 1. They would like our support for their expansion.

April Mustard on behalf of a UAA Public Health capstone project asked questions looking for answers to public health needs of Fairview families and residents. We identified needs for a health clinics, access to food, high concentration of services for homelessness, mental health, and substance abuse. Decrease of community policing has seen an uptick of prostitution, theft, drug dealing, and vandalism.

Legislative Report

Assemblyman Patrick Flynn another sales tax proposal on the 24th. Red light cameras, property tax, public safety and the last chance to put things on the ballot in the spring. Property assessments will go in the mail tomorrow and you can address your concerns about the valuation. He is drafting ideas for the way drones are used in the municipality and applying trespass laws for video obtained that would otherwise require. Bonds are done for school districts, roads, parks and public safety. Alley paving will be part of the bonds that will affect Fairview. His tenure is closing with this meeting, and he is glad that he worked on People Mover and the Fairview Rec Center. Chris Constant thanked him for the funding for the Fairview Business Association and the Fairview Neighborhood Plan.

Tasha Hotch is from Mountain View and a school board candidate because she has a son in public school and would like to see more involvement and opportunity for our children's success.

James Smallwood is a school board candidate with two kids in the public education system. He has heard teacher's frustrations first hand, be an advocate for people, and work for the public.

Draft Design Workshop

We are identifying the problems you have when walking down the streets in Anchorage and collecting that information to provide concrete tools anyone that wants to improve the neighborhood.

Unfinished Business

- LUPM We have presented comments that were addressed. We recommended that there be a special study area for the Gambell corridor, greenbelt from Chester Creek to Ship Creek. We lost to Merrill Field expansion, we lost greenway from Chester Creek to Sitka Park.

New Business

Allen presented a resolution 2017-1 for to oppose changes brought about from the Anchorage Talks Transit system that will systematically disenfranchise Fairview Residents. This plan will essentially decrease the areas that are serviced to many Fairview residents. He believes that People Mover will continually be slashed over years based upon this action.

Allen makes motion to pass the resolution and suspend the form. SJ seconds the motion.

Meeting extended for 15 minutes. Motion seconded by Mike Dzursin.

Motion has been made to empower President to speak to the Mayor's office with the Anchorage Transit Talks. SJ seconds. Motion passes.

SJ moves to adjourn. Leslie seconded. Meeting Adjourned.
