

Tudor Area Community Council Meeting Minutes

Thursday, Feb. 2, 2017

First Church of God on MacInnes & Tudor

Deanne Tuckerman, chair, called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. Last month's meeting minutes were approved.

Assembly Report: Dick Traini was present and gave us a report. The metals recycling businesses have been getting a lot of copper metal for processing. Some of that metal has been removed from new and existing buildings without permission. Mr. Traini wants the recyclers to document who they are buying the copper from so that police can investigate the copper thefts more readily.

He also said that the derelict Northern Lights Inn will be torn down by the end of summer 2017. There is asbestos present which requires remediation.

Mr. Traini later mentioned that there will be \$58 million in school bonds on the ballot in April. There was some discussion of the lot for sale on the north side of 36th Ave. at MacInnes St.

Legislative Report: Neither legislators nor staff were present.

School Board: Not present.

FCC Report: Mr. Traimi said that he gave the same report that he gives to the councils in his area. No one from Tudor Area attended the meeting.

Speakers: Two University of Alaska Anchorage nursing students were present. They asked attendees to participate in a brief survey on the health of the community.

Old Business: None.

New Business: We discussed the MacInnes/Tudor intersection safety hazards in light of accidents at Tudor and Shelikof St. We decided to invite the Alaska Dept. of Transportation to speaker to the council about the situation.
