Like:

- The neighborhood quality of South Addition and we want to retain it.
- The view of the inlet, the park strip, bike trail, the flowers, the mountains and it's close to town.
- Relative low density.
- Centralized location.
- Housing is not "ticky tack."
- Bike trails.
- Mixed incomes, mixed ages.
- Kids can walk to school.
- The trees.
- The quietness of the neighborhood – in some areas, relative safety for our children.
- That it's an established neighborhood.
- Lack of commercial and through traffic.
- Large amount of sunlight still coming through.
- To see the leash law<sup>3</sup> enforced.
- Availability of the bus system.

Recommendations:

- Enforce the leash law.
- Police patrols around schools for speeding cars.
- More patrols for speeders.
- No couplets for South Addition. (14-8)
- Comprehensive plan should speak to the role of the community councils. (19-0)
- Any change to higher residential density be compatible with the existing residential zoning. (20-0)
- Delete objective E under goal F. (15-2)
- Add an objective that states the public's view and access to the inlet should be protected. (17 for)
- The tidewater freeway be constructed (9-15)
