On August 28<sup>th</sup>, the Anchorage Assembly voted to entirely ban disposable plastic shopping bags of any thickness from local retail stores; this was to take effect March 1, 2019. The goal is to reduce litter and encourage consumers to bring their own reusable bags to the store. The Assembly is considering amendments to the plastic bag ban ordinance, and introduced AO No. 2018-110 and AO No. 2018-110(S) at its December 4<sup>th</sup> meeting. The proposed amendments include delaying implementation of the ban to accommodate retailers. An Assembly Worksession is scheduled for December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2:00-3:00 p.m., City Hall, Assembly Conference Room #155, 632 W. 6<sup>th</sup> Ave.

- December 19 PUBLIC HEARING Proposed Addition of Onsite Marijuana Consumption to the Marijuana Retail License, 1:00-4:00 p.m., 4805 Dr. MLK Jr. Ave. The Marijuana Control Board is considering proposed regulation changes to 3 AAC 306 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with onsite marijuana consumption for retail establishments. The draft allows for outdoor consumption areas, if the board finds that compatible with neighborhood uses. Local governments, via ordinance or a ballot question, could bar onsite use or aspects of it, such as smoking. TCC approved comments at our October 5: 2017, meeting, which expressed concerns with the marijuana onsite consumption proposal; four TCC members also testified against the onsite consumption regulations at the Assembly hearing on Oct. 10<sup>th,</sup> 2017. TCC sent our comments to the Marijuana Control Board at that time as well and sent an update version of that letter to the MCB on October 30<sup>th</sup> of this year. TCC President Gleason plans to testify at the hearing.

Properties General Aviation-Related Development at Lake Hood Seaplane Base in Turnagain

Bog. Location is in the southwest corner of Lake Hood Dr. and Helio Pl. consisting of up to 850,000 sq ft.

Authorized uses could include: 23 aircraft tie-down spaces, phased-in development of 120 T-hangers for GA aircraft, season float/snow storage areas and vehicle parking. This same area was proposed for an Airport construction storage/maintenance area last year. The proposal will be on the TCC December 6<sup>th</sup> agenda; the TCC Land Use Committee will be meeting December 13<sup>th</sup> to review the application and provide comments. TCC President Gleason has requested the comment deadline be delayed until sometime next year, due to confusion regarding simultaneous and conflicting land use proposals, and wetland fill permit status for this area of Turnagain Bog.

### **PROJECT UPDATES:**

Westchester Lagoon South Bridge Replacement

Construction to replace the bridge on the south side of Westchester Lagoon started Oct. 15th. Construction schedule will depend on weather conditions. Bridge will reopen for winter trail use after installation, tentatively in January 2019, with surface paving to be completed in Spring 2019. The viewing platform will extend 16 feet out into the lagoon, to give adequate separation between platform users and Coastal Trail users. Suggested detour routes through the Turnagain neighborhood will be posted and available via the Parks website. TCC provided input on design elements at our May 3<sup>rd</sup> TCC meeting and an update was provided at our September 6<sup>th</sup> meeting.

### Alaska Railroad Bridge Over W. Northern Lights Graffiti Removal

Many thanks to MOA Public Works for doing interim work to cover graffiti on the highly visible AKRR bridge in Turnagain! The lighter coat of paint applied this spring will be followed up next year with a more extensive effort (based on funding availability), including full sandblasting and a thicker layer of paint on both the bridge and retaining walls. Graffiti sealant will also be applied.

Proiect involves rehabilitating and widening RW 15/33 and update taxiway geometry to meet FAA standards through the summers of 2018 and 2019. The N/S runway resumed normal operations on October 2<sup>nd</sup> and will remain open throughout the winter. ### **December 2018 Community Council Update**

Friday's Earthquake – Seismologists called Friday's earthquake the most significant in Anchorage since the 1964 Good Friday earthquake in terms of how strong the ground shook. Considering the scale, it's good news that there were no deaths or life-threatening injuries. After 1964, Alaska established stricter building codes that contributed to building the structures that withstood Friday's earthquake. While the earthquake and the aftershocks left us all on edge, Anchorage has a great deal to be thankful for.

The proactive reaction to Friday's earthquake reflects our great leadership. I'd like to extend my appreciation to Governor Walker, Mayor Berkowitz, Anchorage's Municipal Manager Bill Falsey, the Office of Emergency Management, and all of our first responders, including the Anchorage Police Department, the Anchorage Fire Department, the Red Cross, and the Alaska National Guard. I'd also like to acknowledge all the employees who worked hard on Friday and through the weekend to quickly address road, electricity, and water issues in the Anchorage bowl, including the Department of Transportation, Chugach Electric, Enstar, and the Anchorage Waste Water Utility.

Legislation Closing Loophole in Alaska's Sex Offense Statutes – In November, I announced plans to introduce legislation to close a loophole in Alaska's sex offense statutes. The legislation, which is currently being drafted, would add unwanted contact with semen as a sex offense in Alaska. Research provided by the office of Legislative Research Services found that currently, there is no state where ejaculation onto another person—without any direct bodily contact with that person—is formally regarded as an offense of sexual assault against an adult. Thus, this "loophole" is not unique to Alaska. Amending Alaska's sexual assault statutes to address this issue that many Alaskans are concerned about is one step in the right direction towards providing legal protection for victims of such heinous crimes. I look forward to working with my colleagues in the legislature to pass this legislation.

### Anchorage Airport Update December 2018

- ANC North/South Runway Renewal Project: Project involves rehabilitating and widening RW 15/33 (the north/south runway), and updating taxiway geometry to meet FAA standards through the summers of 2018 and 2019.
  - a. The 2018 runway construction is now complete. The North/South Runway resumed normal operations and will remain open throughout the winter.
  - b. Construction will recommence in April 2019, requiring all aircraft to be shifted to the east-west runways.
  - c. To stay up to date on the project and to submit comments, visit the website at anc15-33.com.
- 2. Terminal Concessions:
  - a. Jet Sunglass kiosk by the Concourse C post security Starbucks will be opening in December.
  - b. Brookstone in Concourse C has closed. Tenant David Green will be temporary leasing space.
- 3. Ted Stevens Commemorative Exhibit: Installation by the Ted Stevens Foundation is underway and scheduled for December completion. Memorial is located at the start of Concourse C in the secure area, and will feature a bronzed statue of Senator Stevens to accompany an upgraded seating area.
- 4. Storm Water Application Permit Review: ADEC expects to release the draft ANC Storm Water Permit for a 60 day public notice for public comment in December. A public hearing is likely to be held some time the week of January 14th.
- 5. Quick Cargo Facility Expression of Interest: The Airport is seeking qualified applicants to submit an Expression of Interest outlining their interest, capabilities, and expertise in the construction and operation of a Quick Cargo Center Warehouse Facility at ANC. - 6. Lake Hood Seaplane Base Frozen Lakes: Winter operations are in effect, and we are requesting everyone's help to spread the reminder to please stay off the ice. 


